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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### STAFF ACCOUNTING BULLETIN NO. 57

The Commission staff has issued Staff Accounting Bulletin No. 57 to provide its view as to the appropriate accounting for contingent warrants issued by a company to certain customers in sales agreements. (Rel. SAB-57)

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### MARTIN I. SAPOSNICK AND NEIL A. FOX CITED

The Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement from Martin I. Saposnick in a public administrative proceeding under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act. Saposnick, without admitting or denying the allegations, consented to a Commission order sanctioning him. Specifically, the Commission ordered him: not to associate with a securities broker or dealer for 30 days; and, for six months following the suspension, prohibited him from participating in any public offering of securities except to accept unsolicited purchase orders, and from accepting orders to sell shares under Rule 144 without first obtaining an opinion of counsel that the transaction is exempt from the registration requirements.

The Commission also initiated an administrative proceeding against Neil A. Fox. Fox, without admitting or denying the allegations, consented to findings and an order by the Commission censuring him for aiding and abetting violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and Exchange Act by accepting orders from Fisher and payments for shares from Cymaticolor Corporation when he knew or should have known that they were involved in a manipulation. 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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### COMPLAINT NAMES CYMATICOLOR CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on June 27 in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against Cymaticolor Corporation, of Edison, New Jersey, Joel Green, Morton Balon, John J. Connolly, III, Jack R. Driben, Louis Fisher, Martin I, Saposnick and Irwin N. Schneider. The complaint also seeks ancillary relief against Green.

The complaint alleges that: in December 1980 and January 1981, Cymaticolor, Green and Fisher manipulated Cymaticolor's initial public offering of securities; these defendants, together with Connolly and Driben, and aided and abetted by Balon, then engaged in schemes to manipulate the market for the stock between January 1981 and June 1982 (during this period Green distributed unregistered stock, in part through Connolly, realizing proceeds of approximately \$1.5 million in violation of the registration provisions); Cymaticolor, Green, Saposnick and Schneider intentionally violated the anti-fraud provisions by failing to disclose payments of finders fees in the offering; Saposnick violated the registration provisions in the resale of the finders' shares; and Cymaticolor, aided and abetted by Green and Balon, violated the reporting and bookkeeping provisions.

Balon and Saposnick consented, without admitting or denying the allegations, to Final Judgments restraining and enjoining them from violating specific provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Cymaticolor Corp., et al., 84 Civil 4508 [DNE], SDNY, June 27, 1984). (LR-10437) [see Rel. 34-21105]

## JEFFREY A. FISCHER PRELIMINARILY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on July 2 a Judgment of Preliminary Injunction and Other Relief was entered against Jeffrey A. Fischer. The Judgment preliminarily enjoined Fischer from further violation of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Fischer consented to the Judgment without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations. Fischer was enjoined from: (1) misrepresenting to customers that they were purchasing securities when in fact he was converting their funds to his own use; (2) misrepresenting securities positions in customer accounts; (3) sending purported "interest" checks on non-existent securities; and (4) sending false confirmations to customers in order to conceal his fraud. The Judgment also froze Fischer's assets, pending further order of the Court. Finally, the Judgment appointed a Special Master to prepare a report for the Court on the appropriate course of action to be taken regarding Fischer's 80% stockholding in a corporation which owns a professional basketball team. (SEC v. Jeffrey A. Fischer, MD FL, 84-819-CIV-T-17). (LR-10461)

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### ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Alabama Power Company, subsidiary of The Southern Company, to sell an existing transmission line to a nonaffiliate. (Rel. 35-23367 - July 17)

### AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to act as indemnitor, guarantor and/or surety for the benefit of its subsidiaries in certain situations. (Rel. 35-23368 - July 17)

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### UNLISTED TRADING SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 2 to comment on the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock (\$.10 par value) of RPC Energy Services, Inc. which is listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchange and is reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. ### UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the applications of the Boston Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in seven issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchange and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. (Rel. 34-21140)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed by: The National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-84-7) that requires applicants and participants to respond to a questionnaire upon application and annually thereafter. The questionnaire reflects a firm's activities outside of registered clearing agencies.

(Rel. 34-21146); and The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-84-14) to enhance Amex's existing AUTOPER automated order execution system with an odd-lot feature known as AUTOPER ODD-LOT. (Rel. 34-21150)

### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-84-23) to adopt on a permanent basis procedures designed to enhance the operation of its Automated Bonds System. (Rel. 34-21149)

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### SEARS MORTGAGE SECURITIES CORPORATION

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
