OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, JULY 26, 1984 - 2:30 p.m.

The subject matter of the July 26 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to adopt Rules 26a-1 and 26a-2 under the Investment Company Act of 1940 which implement the Commission's authority to prescribe reasonable administrative fees for unit investment trusts, and permit insurance company separate accounts to engage in certain custodianship activities and to make certain deductions from account assets. (2) Consideration of whether to publish a concept release requesting public comments concerning possible legislation to: (1) implement the "waiver by conduct" concept by declaring that the purchase or sale of securities in the U.S. from other countries shall constitute an implied consent to - (a) disclosure of relevant evidence concerning the transaction, (b) service upon the U.S. broker-dealer that effected the transaction, and (c) the exercise of in personam jurisdiction by U.S. courts and the Commission; and (2) codify the authority of the courts to impose additional sanctions in subpoena enforcement actions and in discovery conducted in Commission enforcement actions. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CONSENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST SUNDANCE GOLD MINING AND EXPLORATION, INC.

The New York Regional Office announced that on July 5 the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction by Consent against Sundance Gold Mining and Exploration, Inc. of Las Vegas, Nevada. Sundance was permanently enjoined from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The April 12, 1983 complaint alleges that: Sundance and seven other defendants, Thomas F. Quinn, A. Frank Sidoti, Amfco Securities, Inc., Alan Scop, Murry Rothfleish, Robert Redmer and Gary Wolf, participated in acts, practices and courses of business which violated the registration provisions of the securities laws; these defendants, along with two other defendants, Joseph Garofalo and Irving Orenstein, violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws; these activities surround the issuance of \$1,500,000 of Sundance stock through a purported Regulation A exemption in 1980; there were various misstatements and omissions made during the issuance of Sundance stock; and there were further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the aftermarket for Sundance stock.

The action is pending against Quinn, Sidoti, Amfco, Scop, Rothfleish, Redmer, Wolf, Garofalo and Orenstein. (SEC v. Thomas F. Quinn, et al., SDNY, 83 Civil 2794 [TPG]). (LR-10463)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

An order has been issued granting The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, the authority to acquire up to 8,000 shares of common stock, at \$25 par value, of Columbia Gas Brokerage Corporation (CGB), which will simultaneously become a wholly-owned, nonutility subsidiary. The capitalization will enable CGB to participate as both a general and limited partner in the U.S. Natural Gas Clearing House, engaged as a broker in the natural gas spot market. THE NARRAGANSETT ELECTRIC COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 13 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Narragansett Electric Company, subsidiary of New England Electric System, to extend an increase in its allowable short-term indebtedness. An order has been issued authorizing the solicitation of proxies in connection therewith. (Rel. 35-23370 - July 19)

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Allegheny Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to issue and sell short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to a dealer on a non-competitive basis. (Rel. 35-23371 - July 19)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-84-22) to offer a new broad-based index option contract based on an index having twice the value of the NYSE Composite Index. These options will trade concurrently with the NYSE's previously listed options on the NYSE Composite Index. (Rel. 34-21153)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. (SR-CBOE-84-17) to delete from Rule 3.2 the requirement that applicants for individual membership be citizens of the United States or of a country approved by the Board of Directors of the CBOE. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN SOUTHWEST FINANCIAL CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act on an application by American Southwest Financial Corporation that the trusteeship of the Valley National Bank of Arizona under five indentures of American is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee.
