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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND  
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

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### PAN AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL, INC. CHARGED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Section 15(c)(4) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Pan American International, Inc. of Aurora, Colorado. The Commission is authorized in Section 15(c)(4) to publish its findings and issue an order requiring compliance if the Commission finds that the issuer has failed to comply with the registration statement and reporting provisions of the Exchange Act.

The Division of Enforcement's allegations are (a) that the Registrant's Form 10 registration statement included improper accounting treatments involving the write up of assets, omitted to state facts respecting Registrant's president's connection with the prior bankruptcy of another company, failed to include a required audited financial statement, and (b) that the Registrant also failed to file periodic reports required by Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act.

A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the staff's allegations and to afford Registrant an opportunity to present any defenses. (Rel. 34-21278)

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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

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### REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY AGENDA AND RULES SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW

The Commission published on September 5, under the Regulatory Flexibility Act, an agenda of open and anticipated rulemaking actions, a listing of rules scheduled for review in the next 12 months and a listing of rulemaking actions and reviews completed since the publication of the April 1984 agenda. Copies of the release, which identifies the entries, and the individual entries, are available to the public in the Commission's Public Reference Room. (File S7-30-84).

The agenda, including the text of the individual entries, will be published in the Federal Register on or before October 31, 1984 as part of a government-wide Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations.

The Commission seeks comment on the individual open or anticipated rulemaking actions, and on the particular rules scheduled for review. 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## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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### MICHAEL A. ROSENBAUM SENTENCED

The Boston Regional Office and the Office of the U.S. Attorney announced that a former Dedham, Massachusetts man, Michael A. Rosenbaum, was sentenced on September 4 to six months in prison to be followed by two years probation on his plea of guilty on six counts of securities fraud and two counts of mail fraud. The sentence was imposed by the Honorable John J. McNaught of the U.S. District for the District of Massachusetts. Judge McNaught conditioned probation on Rosenbaum making \$32,000 in restitution to certain broker-dealers which the indictment charged him with defrauding.

In 1981, Rosenbaum was permanently enjoined in an action brought by the Boston Regional Office. The current criminal proceedings arose out of the activities which were the subject of the Commission's civil complaint. (U.S. v. Rosenbaum, U.S.D.C. D.MA., C.R. 84-79-MC.) (LR-10519)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved the following proposed rule changes: Boston Stock Exchange, Inc. (BSE) - (SR-BSE-84-2) to expand the pilot program established for execution of standard odd-lot market orders to purchase or sell shares in American Telephone and Telegraph (AT&T) and the equity issues created as a result of the AT&T divestiture to include all BSE issues (Rel. 34-21300); and Pacific Securities Depository Trust Company (PSDTC) - (SR-PSDTC-84-8) to establish a Dividend Reinvestment Program (DRP) through which participants with positions in eligible securities can reinvest cash dividends and retain the resulting securities on deposit with PSDTC (Rel. 34-21307).

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following have filed proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4: The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. - (SR-NASD-84-14) to codify and revise generally certain portions of its By-Laws (Rel. 34-21302); The Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. (MSE) - (SR-MSE-84-6) to amend seven sections under MSE Article VIII, Rule 24 (Uniform Code of Arbitration) by, among other things, enabling parties to amend their pleadings as of right after having filed and before an arbitration panel is established, and by expressly granting arbitrators discretion to bar presentation of defenses and facts not pleaded, upon objection by an adversary party (Rel. 34-21303); and The American Stock Exchange, Inc. - (SR-Amex-84-24) to amend eight of its arbitration rules. Among other changes, the proposed amendments would affect the six year time limitations on arbitrations, the pleadings of responding parties, the procedures for amendment of pleadings, fee schedules, and the jurisdictional limit for small claim proceedings (Rel. 34-21305).

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of September 10 (Rel. 34-21302) and September 17 (Rel. 34-21303 and 34-21305).

### NOTICE OF IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following have filed proposed rule changes which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A): The Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. (MSE) - (SR-MSE-84-7) to amend MSE Article XI, Rule 4, by adding Subsection .02 thereunder, which would set a fee schedule for late filings made by member firms and member organizations which are required to file with the Exchange monthly, quarterly and annual reports under MSE Article XI and SEC Rule 17a-5 (Rel. 34-21304); and The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. - (SR-NYSE-84-31) to provide for new Forms 97A and 97B to be used in the administration and enforcement of recently amended NYSE Rule 97 (Rel. 34-21306).

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
