ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST CHARLES M. BLAIR

The Commission instituted an administrative proceeding against Charles M. Blair of Toluca Lake, California, president and sole owner of Charles M. Blair & Co., a broker-dealer registered with the Commission. Simultaneous with the institution of these proceedings, Blair submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission accepted. Blair consented to the Commission's Order without admitting or denying any of the facts or findings, other than admitting to the fact that he is permanently enjoined by judgment of the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California from violations of the antifraud provisions and the broker-dealer recordkeeping provisions of the Exchange Act. The Commission ordered that Blair be suspended from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer for 30 days. PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST CHARLES M. BLAIR CO., INC. AND JAMES P. CONGLETON

The Commission instituted an administrative proceeding against Charles M. Blair & Co., Inc. (CMB), a registered broker-dealer with principal offices in Los Angeles, California, and James P. Congleton of Irvine, California. Simultaneous with the institution of this proceeding, CMB and Congleton submitted Offers of Settlement which the Commission accepted. CMB and Congleton consented to the Commission's order without admitting or denying any of the facts or findings.

The Order found that CMB and Congleton wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and that CMB wilfully violated and Congleton wilfully aided and abetted violations of the broker-dealer recordkeeping provisions of the Exchange Act. The Commission found that, beginning in mid-April 1981 and continuing through mid-June 1982, CMB, Congleton and others fraudulently schemed to maintain or increase the price of Universal Energy Corporation (UEC) stock. This scheme enabled them to stabilize or delay the fall of the price of UEC stock.

The Commission censured CMB and ordered it to comply with undertakings designed to prevent the recurrence of the violations, and ordered Congleton suspended from association with any regulated entity for 30 days. (Rel. 34-21590) [see 34-21589 and LR-10636]

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CHARLES M. BLAIR ENJOINED

The Commission filed a civil action against Charles M. Blair alleging that he violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and aided and abetted violations of the broker-dealer books and records provisions of the Exchange Act. Without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, Blair consented to a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction which was signed by the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California on December 18.

Blair, of Toluca Lake, California, is president and sole owner of Charles M. Blair & Co., Inc., a broker-dealer registered with the Commission. The complaint alleges that from about April 1981 until June 1982, in concert with others, Blair fraudulently schemed to maintain or increase the price of Universal Energy Corporation (UEC) stock by reducing the supply of UEC stock in the public market and concurrently creating an artificial appearance of demand for UEC stock. This scheme enabled them to stabilize or delay the fall of the price of UEC's stock. (SEC v. Charles M. Blair, USDC CDCA, Civil Action No. 84-9542). (LR-10636) [see 34-21589 and 34-21590]

**PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS ENTERED
AGAINST JACK AND REGINA DLUGASH**

The Commission announced the entry of Judgments of Permanent Injunction on December 20 against Jack L. Dlugash and Regina Dlugash by U.S. District Judge Henry Bramwell. The Dlugashes consented to the Permanent Injunctions in settlement of a civil injunctive action filed by the Commission on October 27, 1983. The complaint alleges that the Dlugashes did business as unregistered broker-dealers of municipal securities and failed to disclose to persons who traded municipal securities their roles as broker-dealers, their profits, and information concerning the suitability of investments. The Dlugashes are enjoined from violating the broker-dealer registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Judgments also direct the Dlugashes to pay \$36,294 to certain identified purchasers of municipal securities. (SEC v. Jack L. Dlugash and Regina Dlugash, individually and d/b/a Douglas Enterprises and Dewey Enterprises, USDC EDNY, Civil Action No. 83-4750). (LR-10637)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PILGRIM FUND INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 14, 1985 to request a hearing on an application of Pilgrim Fund Inc., et al. (Applicants) for an order to permit certain exchange offers on a basis other than at relative net asset value, and exempting Applicants from the provisions of Section 22(d) of the Investment Company Act to permit such exchange offers. MUTUAL BENEFIT FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 14, 1985 to request a hearing on an application of Mutual Benefit Fund and Mutual Benefit Financial Service Company for an order exempting them from the provisions of Section 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22d-1 to permit sales of the Fund's shares at net asset value without a sales load. MERRILL LYNCH/GREAT WESTERN MORTGAGE SECURITIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 14, 1985 to request a hearing on an application of Merrill Lynch/Great Western Mortgage Securities, Inc. for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14284 - Dec. 19)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, and four of its subsidiaries to enter into certain transactions related to the acquisition of additional undivided interests (up to an aggregate of 40%) in Virginia Electric and Power Company's Bath County Pumped Storage Project. (Rel. 35-23539 - Dec. 20)

MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 14, 1985 to request a hearing on a proposal by Middle South Utilities, Inc., a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, Electec, Inc., for authorization to finance \$1.9 million for Electec's consulting program in 1985. SYSTEM FUELS, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), Louisiana Power & Light Company (LP&L), Mississippi Power & Light Company (MP&L) and New Orleans Public Service, Inc. (NOPSI), subsidiaries of Middle South Utilities, Inc., and their subsidiary, System Fuels, Inc. (SFI). SFI proposes to borrow through December 31, 1987, under a Revolving Credit Agreement with Comerica Bank-Detroit, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$15 million. AP&L, LP&L, MP&L and NOPSI propose to take any necessary action to cause SFI to discharge its obligations under the agreement. (Rel. 35-23541 - Dec. 20)

DELISTING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange to strike all put and call option contracts respecting the common stock of Blue Bell, Inc. (Rel 34-21584)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed under Rule 19b-4 by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. (SR-CBOE-84-25), and approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-84-38) to allow CBOE to begin opening rotations on its index options at 9:00 a.m., Chicago time, and to allow Amex to begin opening rotations for options on the Amex Major Market Index at 10:00 a.m., New York time. Amex's rule change also codifies existing policy respecting opening rotations for options on the Amex Market Value Index. Opening rotations for options on this index option will continue to begin only after 50% of the aggregate value of the component securities have opened on Amex. (Rel. 34-21580)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed by: The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-84-40) to extend the operation of the Registered Representative Rapid Response Service to November 7, 1985. (Rel. 34-21582); and The Midwest Clearing Corporation (SR-MCC-84-10) to make available to MCC participants various physical settlement services for municipal securities transactions. (Rel. 34-21588)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the weeks of December 10 and 17, respectively.

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed change (SR-MSE-84-10) which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Exchange Act to amend the MSE Transaction Fee and Volume Fee Schedules by: modifying current Item and Value charges; decreasing the number of billing categories for members' round lot trades per month and total gross dollar volume per month; and establishing lower value charges for members generating higher total gross dollar volume per month. Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
