ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST RONALD P. HARRINGTON

The Commission today instituted administrative proceedings against Ronald P. Harrington, a certified public accountant, under Rule 2(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice. Concurrent with the institution of these proceedings, Harrington submitted an Offer of Settlement in which he consented to the Commission's Opinion and Order without admitting or denying the allegations therein.

In accepting Harrington's Offer of Settlement, the Commission found that (1) Harrington issued audit reports on the financial statements of Diversified Tech, Inc. for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1983 and for the seven-month period ended July 31, 1984, which were not presented in accordance with GAAP, and (2) his audits were not conducted in accordance with GAAS. The Commission further found that Harrington in conducting his audits of the financial statements of Diversified, failed to obtain sufficient competent evidential matter to form a basis for his unqualified auditors' report.

The Commission, in accepting Harrington's Offer of Settlement, ordered that he be permanently denied the privilege of appearing or practicing before the Commission, provided that Harrington may apply to resume appearing and practicing before the Commission after three years, upon meeting certain conditions and qualifications. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST FRANK M. RUMMONDS

The Commission filed a complaint on March 24 in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of California seeking to enjoin Frank M. Rummonds, a Senior Vice President and former Treasurer of American Savings and Loan Association, the principal operating subsidiary of Financial Corporation of America (FCA), from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws, disgorgement and a penalty under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984 (ITSA). The complaint alleges that Rummonds sold 6,750 shares of FCA common stock while in possession of material, nonpublic information concerning FCA's 1984 financial results.

Concurrent with the filing of the complaint, Rummonds, without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, consented to a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief, enjoining him from violating the above provisions, and further ordering him to disgorge \$20,066.72 in losses avoided and to pay an ITSA penalty in the amount of \$20,066.72. (SEC v. Frank M. Rummonds, USDC EDCA, Civil Action No. 86-0337). (LR-11033)

SECURITIES TRANSFER, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Commission entered on March 17, on default, Judgments of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against Securities Transfer, Inc. (STI), Express Transfers, Inc. (ETI), Sharon Alfonso and Joseph Bumyea, also known as John Hanson. The Judgments, entered by U.S. District Judge G. Kendall Sharp, Middle District of Florida, enjoined the defendants from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Alfonso, STI and ETI were also enjoined from violations of the transfer agent provisions of the securities laws. Bumyea and Alfonso were ordered to disgorge \$221,000 and \$29,000, respectively.

The complaint alleged that Bumyea, Alfonso, STI and ETI obtained funds from other persons through the pledging of improperly issued stock certificates representing securities of companies using STI as a transfer agent. (SEC v. Securities Transfer, Inc., et al., USDC MDPL, Orlando Division, Civil Action No. 85-1049-CIV-ORL). (LR-11032)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

UNIVERSAL HEALTH SERVICES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 14 to request a hearing on an application filed by Universal Health Services, Inc. under Section 310(b)(i)ii) of the Trust Indenture Act. The application declares that the trusteeship of Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company under certain indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify Manufacturers from acting as trustee under one of such indentures. The indentures are dated April 1, 1983, qualified under the Act, under which \$110 million of 7-1/2% convertible subordinated debentures, due April 1, 2008, has been issued, and a new debenture dated February 10, 1986 under which it is proposed to issue \$50 million of 13-1/2% subordinated notes, due 1991, which will not be qualified under the Act. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45

days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
