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## **RULES AND RELATED MATTERS**

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### AMENDMENTS TO FORM S-18 AND RULE 255 OF REGULATION A ADOPTED

The Commission adopted amendments to Form S-18 and Rule 255 of Regulation A to provide that registrants whose principal business operations are conducted or are intended to be conducted in the area covered by the Philadelphia Regional Office may file their Form S-18 registration statements and their Regulation A offering statements, at their option, in the Commission's principal office in Washington, DC or in the Atlanta or New York Regional Offices.

These amendments will be effective on May 16, the date on which the Arlington and Philadelphia Offices are being consolidated into a reconfigured office located in Philadelphia and designated the Philadelphia Regional Office. (Rel. 33-6639)

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## **COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

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### GENERAL COUNSEL PROPOSALS CONCERNING BANKRUPTCY RULES

Daniel L. Goelzer, the Commission's General Counsel, announced today the submission of proposed amendments to the Bankruptcy Rules to the Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Judicial Conference of the United States. The General Counsel's proposed amendments consist of: (1) amendment to specify that a corporate Chapter 11 petition include Exhibit A to Official Form No. 1; (2) amendment to require a general notice to shareholders of their rights to participate in a Chapter 11 case; (3) amendment to require notice to shareholders of any proposed sale of all of the debtor's assets or a substantial asset of the debtor; (4) amendment to clarify that publication notice is required to advise creditors who are not listed on the debtor's schedule of liabilities of the time fixed for filing claims; (5) amendments to clarify that a class proof of claim may be filed in bankruptcy and clarify that the class action provisions of Rule 23, Fed. R. Civ. P., should be available in all contested matters in bankruptcy cases; and (6) amendments setting forth procedures for intervention of right and permissive intervention.

Richard A. Kirby, Assistant General Counsel, will testify at a public hearing on April 17 before the Rules Committee in Washington, DC on these proposed amendments to the Bankruptcy Rules.

E.F. HUTTON & COMPANY INC.  
AND E.F. HUTTON GROUP INC.

A release has been issued noticing the filing of reports of consultants, appointed pursuant to Commission orders issued on October 29, 1985, analyzing E.F. Hutton & Company Inc.'s broker-dealer and investment company operations. One is pursuant to Administrative Proceeding File No. 3-6581, Exchange Act Rel. No. 22579. The other is pursuant to Administrative Proceeding File No. 3-6582, Investment Advisers Act Rel. No. 993). The release also sets forth the time by which interested persons may request to participate in the hearing on Hutton's and E.F. Hutton Group Inc.'s request for permanent relief under Section 9(c) of the Investment Company Act and file written submissions on the matter. (Rel. IC-15052 - April 15)

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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### DAVID KEN YOSHINAGA FOUND IN CIVIL CONTEMPT

The Denver Regional Office announced that on April 1 Chief Judge Sherman G. Finesilver, U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado, made findings that David Ken Yoshinaga was in contempt of the Court's April 22, 1985 Order which required him to turn over \$933,933.15 to the Commission.

Judge Finesilver also found Yoshinaga in contempt of Court for not appearing at the April 1 hearing and ordered him to appear on April 10, at which time sanctions will be imposed. Attorneys fees and costs were awarded to the Commission in an amount to be determined later. (SEC v. Investments Management Co., Inc., et al., Civil Action No. 84-F-901, DC CO). (LR-11053)

### COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST EDWIN O. OATS, OTHERS

The Fort Worth Regional Office filed a complaint on April 3 in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas, Dallas Division, seeking orders of permanent injunction against Edwin O. Oats of Dallas, Texas; James A. Schaffor of Plano, Texas; and Robert D. Shaw of Richardson, Texas. The complaint also seeks an accounting and order of disgorgement against Oats and Shaw.

The defendants are alleged to have violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of fractional undivided interests in oil and gas leases, raising in excess of \$7.25 million from over 250 investors residing in 20 states. In connection with these sales, the defendants misrepresented and omitted to state material facts concerning, among other things, the return an investor would receive on his investment, the risks inherent in oil and gas investments, and the diversion of investors' funds by Oats and Shaw. (SEC v. Edwin Oats, et al., NDTX Dallas Division, Civil Action No. 3-86-0886-T). (LR-11054)

### FUTURESAT INDUSTRIES, INC. NAMED IN COMPLAINT

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on April 11 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Futuresat Industries, Inc. of Irving, Texas. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleges that Futuresat, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended October 31, 1985, and its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarter ended January 31, 1986, filed late Annual and Quarterly Reports and failed to file Notifications of Late Filing. The Commission requests that the Court order Futuresat to file its delinquent Annual and Quarterly Reports and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Futuresat Industries, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-0986). (LR-11059)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### MUTUAL BENEFIT FUNDING, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 6 to request a hearing on an application filed by Mutual Benefit Funding, Inc., an indirect subsidiary of the Mutual Benefit Life Insurance Company, requesting an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-15049 - April 11)

### TWELVE STAR PARTNERS, LTD.

An order has been issued declaring that Twelve Star Partners, Ltd. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-15050 - April 14)

### THE PRUDENTIAL VARIABLE CONTRACT ACCOUNT-II

An order has been issued exempting The Prudential Variable Contract Account-II from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Investment Company Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 to the extent requested. This order permits Prudential, which serves as the underlying investment medium for certain group variable contracts, to use the amortized cost valuation method for the purpose of valuing short-term debt obligations without maintaining a stable price per share. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### WEST TEXAS UTILITIES COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 5 to request a hearing on a proposal by West Texas Utilities Company (WTU), subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to issue through December 31, 1986 by competitive bidding up to 300,000 shares of its preferred stock, par value \$100 per share. The net proceeds from the sale of the preferred stock will be used to repurchase for cash the outstanding shares of WTU's 10.16% preferred stock obtained through a tender offer to the holders thereof. Any proceeds not used for the repurchase of 10.16% preferred stock will be used for the payment of outstanding short-term borrowings incurred and expected to be incurred to finance construction expenditures and other corporate purposes. (Rel. 35-24063 - April 10)

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## LISTING, DELISTING AND UNLISTED TRADING ACTIONS

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### UNLISTED TRADING SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 2 to comment on the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in two issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchanges and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. (Rel. 34-23118)

### WITHDRAWAL SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 2 to comment on the application of STANDARD-BRED PACERS AND TROTTERS INCORPORATED to withdraw its common stock, \$.01 par value, from listing and registration on the Pacific Stock Exchange. (Rel. 34-23119)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed by: The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-86-12) revising the list of Exchange rule violations and applicable fines under its Rule 476A, which provides for the disposition of minor rule violations. (Rel. 34-23104); and The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-86-3) eliminating the exemption from examination that had been available to persons seeking registration with the NASD who were formerly associated with broker-dealers registered under the SECO program. A precondition of the exemption was that the applicant's association with the SECO broker-dealer had not been terminated for two years or more prior to the NASD's receipt of the application for registration. Because the SECO program was abolished more than two years ago, that exemption is no longer available. (Rel. 34-23120)
