COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

STEPHEN WEINSTEIN APPOINTED ATTORNEY FELLOW IN OFFICE OF MUNICIPAL SECURITIES

The Commission's Office of Municipal Securities today announced the selection of Stephen J. Weinstein as an Attorney-Fellow for a two-year term beginning May 24, 1999. Currently, Mr. Weinstein practices as a legal and financial consultant, focusing on infrastructure investments funded with public securities and in partnership with the private sector.

Mr. Weinstein previously served as a financial advisor in the field of municipal securities, assisting issuers in structuring and implementing public bonding programs. He has also been responsible for project financing with an international infrastructure planning firm. In addition, he served as counsel and executive director of the Municipal Assistance Corporation during the time it was providing financing for the City of New York as one of the largest municipal issuers in the United States. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST ASIF AMEEN AND BRUCE BERTSCH

On May 21, the Commission entered an Order Instituting Proceedings Pursuant to Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Asif Ameen (Ameen) of Wichita, Kansas, and Bruce W. Bertsch (Bertsch) of Valley Center, Kansas. The Order alleges that from approximately 1993 through mid 1997, Ameen, while a registered representative of Primeline Securities Corp., a registered broker dealer located in Wichita, Kansas, stole funds from his clients and from other persons. The Order further alleges that Ameen was convicted on April 16, 1998 of four state counts of felony theft and one state count of securities fraud related to his thefts, for which he was sentenced to 32 months in prison and ordered to pay \$60,000 restitution. The Order further alleges that Bertsch, while employed at Primeline as one of Ameen's supervisors, failed reasonably to supervise Ameen with a view to preventing violations of the

antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws.

A hearing will be held before an administrative law judge to determine whether the staff's allegations are true and, if so, what remedial sanctions are appropriate in the public interest, and whether Bertsch should be ordered to pay civil penalties. (Rel. 34-41433; File No. 3-9906)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AND SETTLED AGAINST FRED LIEBAU

On May 21, the Commission entered an Order Instituting Public Administrative Proceedings, Making Findings, and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Fred F. Liebau (Liebau) of Mulvane, Kansas. The Order makes findings that from approximately 1993 through mid 1997, Liebau, while employed at Primeline Securities Corp., a registered broker-dealer based in Wichita, Kansas, was responsible for supervising Asif Ameen (Ameen), who was employed as a registered representative at that firm. The Order further alleges that Ameen was convicted on April 16, 1998 of four counts of felony theft and one state count of securities fraud related to his thefts, for which he was sentenced to 32 months in prison and ordered to pay \$60,000 restitution. The Order further alleges that Bertsch, while employed at Primeline as one of Ameen's supervisors, failed reasonably to supervise Ameen with a view to preventing violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. COURT ORDERS WAIVER OF DISGORGEMENT AND PENALTIES AGAINST MISSISSIPPI BOND COUNSEL DERRYL PEDEN

On May 6, the Honorable Judge Henry T. Wingate, United States District Court Judge for the Southern District of Mississippi, entered an Order on Disgorgement And Penalties setting disgorgement of ill-gotten gains against defendant Derryl W. Peden (Peden) in the amount of \$2,080,753. The order also waived payment of disgorgement and civil penalties based on Peden's demonstrated inability to pay. The May 6 order brings to a close the Commission's injunctive action initially filed against Peden on July 13, 1998. See, SEC v. Derryl W. Peden, Civil Action No. 3:98-CV-483-WS, S.D. Miss.

Previously, on July 15, 1998, the Honorable Judge Henry T. Wingate entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Peden. The judgment permanently enjoined Peden from violating the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws, ordered Peden to comply with an administrative cease-and-desist order which had been entered against Peden by the Commission on December 2, 1994 (Rel. 34-35045), and ordered that the amount of Peden's disgorgement of ill-gotten gains and civil penalties, if any, would be set upon subsequent motion by the SEC. Peden consented to the relief without admitting or denying the SEC's allegations.

In the injunctive action, the Commission alleged, among other things, that between 1987 and April 1996, Peden induced 39 Mississippi municipalities to offer and sell 74 separate urban

renewal revenue note issues totaling approximately \$287,300,000. The notes were issued based on an opinion from Peden, acting as bond counsel, that interest on the notes was exempt from the federal income tax. The complaint alleged that Peden knew or was reckless in not knowing that a substantial risk existed that interest on the notes was not tax exempt. That risk was not disclosed to investors. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NEW CENTURY ENERGIES, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing New Century Energies, Inc. (NCE), a registered holding company, to solicit proxies from its shareholders to obtain their approval of the proposed merger of NCE with and into Northern States Power Company (NSP), a Minnesota public-utility holding company exempt from registration under Section 3(a)(2) of the Act. NSP would be the surviving entity of the merger. At a later date, NCE intends to submit an application with the Commission under the Act requesting authority to consummate the merger and related transactions. (Rel. 35-27031)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-98-10). The Commission also issued a notice of filing and granted accelerated approval to Amendment No. 2 to the proposed rule change submitted under Rule 19b-4 by the New York Stock Exchange relating to NYSE Rule 115, the disclosure of specialists' orders. Publication of the notice and order is expected in the Federal Register during the week of May 24. (Rel. 34-41421)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change (SR-Amex-99-17) filed by the American Stock Exchange relating to the listing and trading of term notes linked to an index of Select Sector SPDRs has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of May 24. (Rel. 34-41423)

A proposed rule change (SR-PCX-99-12) filed by the Pacific Exchange amending PCX Rule 15 relating to the PCX application of the OptiMark System has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is

expected in the Federal Register during the week of May 24. (Rel. 34-41430)
