COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

JOSEPH LOMBARD NAMED COUNSEL TO CHAIRMAN ARTHUR LEVITT

Securities and Exchange Commission Chairman Arthur Levitt announced on July 26 that Joseph C. Lombard has been named Counsel to the Chairman. Mr. Lombard, 35, succeeds Annette Nazareth, who was recently named Director of the Commission's Division of Market Regulation. Mr. Lombard will advise the Chairman on a range of market regulation issues.

Chairman Levitt said, "I am quite pleased that Joe has become a part of our team. Joe has a tremendous depth of knowledge of the securities industry and has a keen understanding of the markets. I am confident his insight and skills will be of great benefit to the Commission. This is a particularly exciting time in the area of market regulation and Joe will play an important role in the Commission's activities in overseeing this area."

Mr. Lombard comes to the Commission from O'Melveny & Myers LLP in Washington, DC where he served as Special Counsel from February 1998 to July 1999 and as an Associate from April 1995 to January 1998. From September 1993 to March 1995 he practiced at a small firm in Richmond, Virginia. While in private practice, Mr. Lombard counseled investment advisers and broker-dealers regarding compliance with various aspects of the securities laws. Mr. Lombard began his legal career as a Staff Attorney in the Securities and Exchange Commission's Enforcement Division where he worked from September 1990 to September 1993. Mr. Lombard has been an Adjunct Professor at Georgetown University Law Center since 1996.

Mr. Lombard earned his J.D. from Georgetown University Law Center, cum laude, in 1990, his M.Sc. (Econ.), with distinction, from the London School of Economics in 1987, and his A.B. from Georgetown University College of Arts and Sciences, cum laude, in 1986. (Press Rel. 99-84)

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

TWO SETTLEMENTS IN INTERNET SWEEP CASE

On July 26, the Commission issued two orders that settled administrative proceedings previously instituted against Robert J. Stahl of Chandler, Arizona, and Elizabeth A. Boyd of Canada and Ft. Myers, Florida. Stahl and Boyd each consented to the issuance of an order, without admitting or denying the findings contained in their respective orders. According to the orders, Stahl and Boyd offered to an Arizona Corporation Commission undercover investigator interests in various "high-yield" investment programs involving the use of so-called "prime bank guarantees" or the trading of putative bank instruments on overseas markets. The orders find that the putative investments were initially offered on a website Stahl created called "Inve\$tit Opportunities." The orders further find that the investment vehicles promoted by Stahl and Boyd did not exist, and that Stahl and Boyd solicited investments in these fictitious programs using false and misleading statements. No investor funds were lost as a result of the conduct of Boyd and Stahl. The respective orders against Stahl and Boyd find that each violated Sections 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act. The Commission ordered Stahl and Boyd to cease and desist from current and future violations of these antifraud provisions of the Securities Act. (Refs. 33-7705, 33-7706; File No. 3-9896)

B. DAVID GILLILAND JAILED FOR CONTEMPT

On June 22, 1999, Judge Joe Kendall of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas in Dallas ordered B. David Gilliland of Bluewater Bay, Florida, and Memphis, Tennessee, jailed for contempt. Judge Kendall ordered Gilliland confined until he pays the remaining \$1.695 million of \$2.745 million which Gilliland and others have been ordered to pay to a court-appointed receiver.

On November 13, 1998, the Commission filed a proceeding against seventeen (17) individuals and entities alleging that they had swindled hundreds of investors throughout Texas and much of the rest of the United States in raising \$14 million in non-existent "prime bank" note programs. In connection with the Commission's action, the Court appointed a receiver to gather all assets obtained by fraud. In the course of his engagement, the receiver learned that Hammersmith Trust, L.L.C., an entity controlled by Gilliland, had received in excess \$2.745 million.

On March 26, 1999, Hammersmith, Gilliland and others agreed to a court order requiring the payment of \$2.745 million to the receiver. After Hammersmith, Gilliland and the others failed to make timely payment of the final \$1.695 million, Judge Kendall held Hammersmith and Gilliland in contempt and gave them an additional forty-five (45) days to make payment. Hammersmith and Gilliland again failed

to make payment. Gilliland attempted to avoid imprisonment by placing Hammersmith into bankruptcy.

Yesterday, after Gilliland testified that Hammersmith has \$42 million in assets, Judge Kendall found Gilliland in contempt and ordered him held in the custody of the United States Marshal until payment is made. SEC SUES HONG KONG RESIDENT AND HIS COMPANY FOR INSIDER TRADING IN OMNIPOINT AND DEFENDANTS SETTLE BY PAYING OVER \$2 MILLION

On July 26, the Commission filed a civil complaint in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York against Hong Kong resident Samson Hui and a company of which he is part owner, Rich Leader Enterprises Limited, in connection with their purchases five weeks ago, on June 21 and 22, 1999, of the common stock of Omnipoint Corporation, a Bethesda, Maryland based company specializing in telecommunications. The complaint alleges that the defendants engaged in insider trading prior to the June 23, 1999 public announcement that Omnipoint would be acquired by VoiceStream Wireless Corporation, another telecommunications firm, and that VoiceStream's controlling shareholder, Hutchison Telecommunications PCS (USA) Limited, has committed to invest \$957 million into the new combined entity. Hutchison Telecommunications PCS (USA) Limited is an indirect subsidiary of Hutchison Whampoa, a Hong Kong conglomerate. The complaint alleges that the defendants violated Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder.

The complaint alleges that on Monday, June 21, 1999 and Tuesday, June 22, 1999, the defendants, in a series of transactions and through two brokerage accounts, accumulated 121,000 shares of Omnipoint common stock at a cost of over \$2.5 million. Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, the defendants agreed to settle the civil action by consenting, without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, to the entry of an order permanently enjoining them from violating Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, requiring them to disgorge \$1,020,462.50 in trading profits, plus prejudgment interest, and requiring them to pay a penalty under the Insider Trading and Securities Fraud Enforcement Act of \$1,020,462.50. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Depository Trust Company (DTC) filed a proposed rule change (SR-DTC-99-10) under Section 19(b)(1) of the Exchange Act that will add a new service for the deposit and processing of restricted

securities using DTC's Restricted Deposit Service (RDS). Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of July 26. (Rel. 34-41635)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-99-19) to adopt a new interpretation of Rule 35 (Floor Employees to be Registered). (Rel. 34-41626)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Depository Trust Company (DTC) filed a proposed rule change (SR-DTC-99-18) under Section 19(b)(1) of the Exchange Act. Under the proposed rule change, DTC will require that its participants who provide settlement information solely through DTC's proprietary Participant Terminal System (PTS) submit to DTC, no later than September 15, 1999, a Year 2000 compliance acknowledgment demonstrating their operational capability. The Commission has approved the proposed rule change on an accelerated basis. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of July 26. (Rel. 34-41640)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-99-25) filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange relating to the market-maker surcharge fee schedule has become immediately effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of July 26. (Rel. 34-41625)
