INTRODUCTION

THIS SECTION PROVIDES INFORMATION FOR SIX KINDS OF FREQUENTLY-
USED VARIABLES:

- A) THREE-DIGIT INDUSTRY VARIABLES
- B) TWO-DIGIT INDUSTRY VARIABLES
- C) ONE-DIGIT INDUSTRY VARIABLES
- D) THREE-DIGIT OCCUPATION VARIABLES
- E) DUNCAN SOCIOECONOMIC INDEX OF OCCUPATION
- F) ONE-DIGIT OCCUPATION VARIABLES

THREE-DIGIT VARIABLES (I.E., TYPES "A" AND "D" ABOVE) ARE
PRIMARY VARIABLES IN THAT THEY ARE CODED DIRECTLY BY CENSUS BUREAU
PERSONNEL FROM THE VERBAL DESCRIPTIONS OBTAINED IN THE INTERVIEWS.
TWO- AND ONE-DIGIT INDUSTRY VARIABLES AND ONE-DIGIT OCCUPATION VARI-
ABLES ARE RECODES OR CATEGORIZATIONS OF THEIR THREE-DIGIT
COUNTERPARTS. LASTLY, THE DUNCAN INDEX VARIABLES ARE COMPLEX
CONSTRUCTS ASSIGNED ON THE BASIS OF UP TO THREE VARIABLES: THREE-
DIGIT OCCUPATION, THREE-DIGIT INDUSTRY, AND CLASS OF WORKER.

PART ONE BELOW IS THE DESCRIPTION OF THE ONE-, TWO-, AND
THREE-DIGIT INDUSTRY VARIABLES, SHOWING THE CODES AND DESCRIPTIONS
APPLYING TO EACH. PART TWO SHOWS THE CODES AND DESCRIPTIONS FOR
ONE- AND THREE-DIGIT OCCUPATION VARIABLES. IN ADDITION, PART TWO
CONTAINS PART OF THE ASSIGNMENT SCHEDULE FOR THE DUNCAN INDEX
VARIABLES, THE REMAINDER OF WHICH IS CONTAINED IN TABLE ONE.

LETTER CODES 'A' THROUGH 'M' WERE EMPLOYED IN THE CLASSIFICATION OF INDUSTRY. IN ORDER TO ELIMINATE ALL ALPHABETIC CODES FROM THE TAPES, WE HAVE SUBSTITUTED NUMERIC CODES FOR THOSE WHICH ORIGINALLY CONTAINED LETTERS.

NOTE 2. THE TWO-DIGIT CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM PROVIDED FOR THE ASSIGNMENT OF EITHER A NUMBER OR A MIXED NUMBER-LETTER CODE TO EACH CATEGORY. IN ORDER TO ELIMINATE ALL ALPHABETIC CODES FROM THE TAPES, WE HAVE SUBSTITUTED NUMERIC CODES FOR THOSE WHICH ORIGINALLY CONTAINED LETTERS.
