- Hiking the Wilderness**  
Do not use this map for hiking. Get detailed topographic maps.  
Permits required for all overnight wilderness stays. Obtain permits at a Wilderness Information Center (WIC). Call 360-565-3100 or visit a WIC to get permits, trail information or bear canisters. Wilderness users should inquire about river ford locations, trail condition and food storage requirements.
- The Coast**  
Caution: Don't get trapped by high tides; get current tide chart at ranger station. When hiking, watch for targets marking overland trails.  
Sudden high waves can pick up beach logs and turn them into weapons; they can kill.  
On the coast, all food garbage and scented items must be stored in hard-sided food containers like bear canisters. These are available to borrow from ranger stations that issue wilderness camping permits.  
Most reefs, rocks, islets, and islands (except the James Island group) are designated wilderness and national wildlife refuges. CLOSED to visitors to protect wildlife. Boats must remain 200 yards from the islands.
