




Atlantic Shark Commercial Fishery Update

Below are **preliminary** landings estimates in metric tons (mt) and (lbs) dressed weight (dw) for the Atlantic Shark commercial fisheries for the 1st trimester season of 2007. **The landings estimates include landing reports received as of February 28, 2007; however, these reports present preliminary landings, as some dealers have not yet reported.** The landings presented below are total landings reported through the Pelagic Dealer Compliance (PDC), or Quota Monitoring System, and the Automated Landings Reporting System (ALS), or General Canvass.

*In the March 13, 2007 NMFS Atlantic Shark Commercial Fishery Update, 35.3 mt dw of large coastal shark was reported landed this year in the South Atlantic even though that region was closed. NMFS has since looked into the discrepancy and found that 35.3 mt dw of large coastal shark was actually landed in the Gulf of Mexico, but reported by South Atlantic dealers. The 35.5 mt dw of large coastal shark is now counted toward the Gulf of Mexico quota.
