## **Atlantic Shark Commercial Fishery Update**

Below are preliminary landings estimates in metric tons (mt) and (lbs) dressed weight (dw) for the Atlantic Shark commercial fisheries for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> trimester seasons of 2007. The landings estimates include landing reports received as of July 31, 2007; however, these reports present preliminary landings, as some dealers have not yet reported. The landings presented below are total landings reported through the Pelagic Dealer Compliance (PDC) (previously known as the Quota Monitoring System), and the Automated Landings Reporting System (ALS) (previously known as the General Canvass).

<sup>\*</sup> Please note that for LCS, the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> seasons of 2007 are merged for the Gulf of Mexico and South Atlantic regions. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> season, the North Atlantic region opened on July 6 and closed on July 31<sup>st</sup>. During the 3<sup>rd</sup> season, the North Atlantic region is closed for LCS.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Although the Gulf of Mexico large coastal shark fishery does not open until September 1<sup>st</sup>, landings from vessels fishing in state waters have occurred in this region. Per 50 CFR § 635.27(b)(1), state landings are counted against the Federal quota. NMFS is working with individual states to resolve these issues and will be taking these overharvests into consideration through future regulations including Amendment 2 to the Consolidated HMS FMP.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Please note that dealers located in closed regions are not permitted to purchase sharks landed in open regions [50 CFR § 635.28(b)(3)] and may be subject to enforcement actions. However, NMFS continues to see incidences of cross-region purchasing during closed seasons. For example, during the 2007 second trimester, NMFS originally received reports from Gulf of Mexico dealers totaling 45.5 mt dw of large coastal landings. Upon further inspection, NMFS observed that 9.7 mt dw of the reported 45.5 mt dw amount were landed in the South Atlantic region. The 9.7 mt dw of large coastal shark has therefore been reallocated towards the South Atlantic quota.
