

Atlantic Shark Commercial Fishery Update

Below are preliminary landings estimates in metric tons (mt) and pounds (lbs) dressed weight (dw) for the Atlantic Shark commercial fisheries for the 1st trimester season of 2008. These preliminary landings estimates include landing reports received as of June 11, 2008. These landings all appear to be from state permitted vessels, not federally permitted vessels. The landings presented below are total landings reported through the Pelagic Dealer Compliance (PDC) (previously known as the Quota Monitoring System), and the Automated Landings Reporting System (ALS) (previously known as the General Canvass). Due to the privacy regulations of some states such as North Carolina, NMFS is unable to remove all instances where dealers report in both the PDC and ALS. As a result, some landings may be inflated.

Per 50 CFR § 635.27(b)(1), state landings are counted against the Federal quota. Please note that dealers located in closed regions are not permitted to purchase sharks landed in open regions (50 CFR § 635.28(b)(3)) and may be subject to enforcement actions.

Please note that the Final Amendment 2 to the Atlantic Highly Migratory Species (HMS) Fishery Management Plan (FMP) will be effective July 24, 2008. All landings data will be accounted for as necessary. Also, a Federal Register notice announcing the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for Amendment 3 to the HMS FMP for small coastal sharks (SCS)



published on May 7, 2008 (FR 73 25665). Scoping meetings for this action are being scheduled and will be published in a future Federal Register notice.
