PHILIPPINES FISH TALES

The Philippines hosts some of the world's most diverse coral reefs, but its fishing industry is in decline due to habitat destruction and unsustainable fishing practices.

USAID is helping by introducing new practices in the Danajon Bank in Bohol; the Calamianes Islands in Palawan; the northern coastal bay areas of Surigao del Sur; and the area around Bongao and Tawi-Tawi. Each of these is an important biodiversity conservation area.

The fishermen are directly involved in planning and implementing the project, while USAID is collecting baseline data. Together they are finding new ways to join conservation and increased productivity.

USAID is assisting the community in Bongao, Philippines make ends meet by helping to implement good fishery management.

RUSSIA: ADOPTS NEW METHODS OF PRENATAL AND INFANT CARE

Thirteen years after the demise of the Soviet Union, the Russian health sector still faces major challenges. To address some maternal and child health problems, USAID programs are encouraging breast feeding, training hospital staff and involving family more directly in child birth.

At USAID project sites, breastfeeding has increased by half and repeat abortions have been reduced. Recognizing USAID's success, UNICEF now gives "Baby-Friendly Hospital" certifications to facilities that follow program guidelines. USAID methods are also being incorporated into medical school curricula, and hospitals are learning to save funds to improve conditions in delivery rooms.

Breastfeeding increased by more than 50 percent and women were more than 40 percent more likely to want family participation in the birth process.

HOOP DREAMS IN ANGOLA

Lito Elias is a 15-year-old with bright eyes and a shy smile. Although he probably once had polio, he believes a “fitzero” (wizard) cursed him and left him unable to use his legs.

But Lito is a force on the basketball court, thanks to the wheelchair USAID’s Sports for Life Program gave him. Spinning and popping wheelies between quarters, he is an aggressive and popular player.

The wheelchair has also helped at school. He wants to be a doctor and often dreams of representing his home province, Moxico, in a national wheelchair basketball competition.

NEW IRAQI CURRENCY CELEBRATES THE PEOPLE

Saddam Hussein ran Iraq's printing presses whenever he needed cash. Naturally, this led to high inflation and plummeting living standards. In late 2003, USAID, working with the Coalition Provisional Authority and the Treasury Department, introduced a new currency and put 4.62 trillion new dinars into circulation. The new dinar pays tribute to the Iraqi nation and its history. Along with a reform of the banking system, USAID is helping develop an independent central bank, new trade laws, and a modern commercial code. The new currency is used throughout the nation and has not only held its value, but gained strength.

“OPENING DOORS” SAVES GIRLS FROM EXCLUSION

Melissa and Melisia were the first two girls from their Peruvian town to register for school. There they encountered two very new challenges—learning Spanish and interacting with the male students.

But both Quechua-speaking girls benefited from a unique USAID program called Opening Doors, which promotes bilingual education, trains teachers and encourages girls' education in 150 Peruvian communities. Within three years, Melissa and Melisia had completed fourth grade and were fully integrated into their schools. Furthermore, due to their parents' and teachers' support, the girls formed a musical duet and perform in nearby communities.

The project helped to improve primary education and health conditions of students, promote early education, strengthen regional planning capacities, and encourage democratic principles in schools, families and communities.

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN

When USAID officers discovered that a third of the infants in El Alto, Bolivia had not been not fully vaccinated against pertussis, tetanus, polio, hepatitis B, and Hemophilus influenza B meningitis, they approached the Ministry of Health and local health care officials about the matter.

The result was a vaccination campaign. Neighborhood committees trained “manzaneras”—local women—to go door-to-door and educate parents about vaccination. During the campaign, over 5,000 children received doses of the vaccine, raising the rate of fully immunized children to 81% and demonstrating again the effectiveness of a collaborative approach to public health.

The overall rate of children fully immunized, as measured by those receiving their third dose, reached 81%.

“CLEANTOWN OF KOUNGHEUL”

The Senegalese town of Kougheul had long been troubled by unsanitary conditions. There was no sewage system or garbage dump. Waste disposal was haphazard. Efforts to improve conditions were blocked by a lack of coordination, communication, and leadership.

In 2003, however, a new administration began working with USAID to raise public awareness of sanitation issues and organize community meetings on the subject. This led to the “Clean Town of Kougheul” initiative and a community management structure.

Today, thanks to Kougheul’s new sense of shared responsibility, there is less litter, households bag their garbage, and puddles are filled with sand.

SERBIAN STUDENTS PROMOTE ENERGY EFFICIENCY

Serbia long suffered from Soviet-style industrial production and environmental neglect. The Balkan Wars delayed change and added to the problems. By 2001, the country faced critical electrical shortages.

In response, USAID launched the innovative Green Schools program. This introduces energy and environmental education—as well as conservation programs—into schools in southern Serbia. Some 10,000 pupils and 800 teachers have taken part. In Razanj, for example, students put on a series of plays, which drew students and parents from neighboring villages. Now, both the school and the people of Razanj are working together on environmental protection and energy conservation.

TRAINING OPENS MANY DOORS

Jordan's Zeinab Momani was unable to attend university, so when her brother told her about a USAID business program, she jumped at the opportunity.

After conducting a feasibility study and a market needs assessment, Zeinab obtained a loan and opened a nursery and kindergarten in her village. Today, she has 110 students enrolled and she employs nine women.

By starting her own business, Zeinab felt she was "changing the stereotypical image of women and proving to those around me that the Jordanian woman is capable of participating in the social and economic development if she has the opportunity."

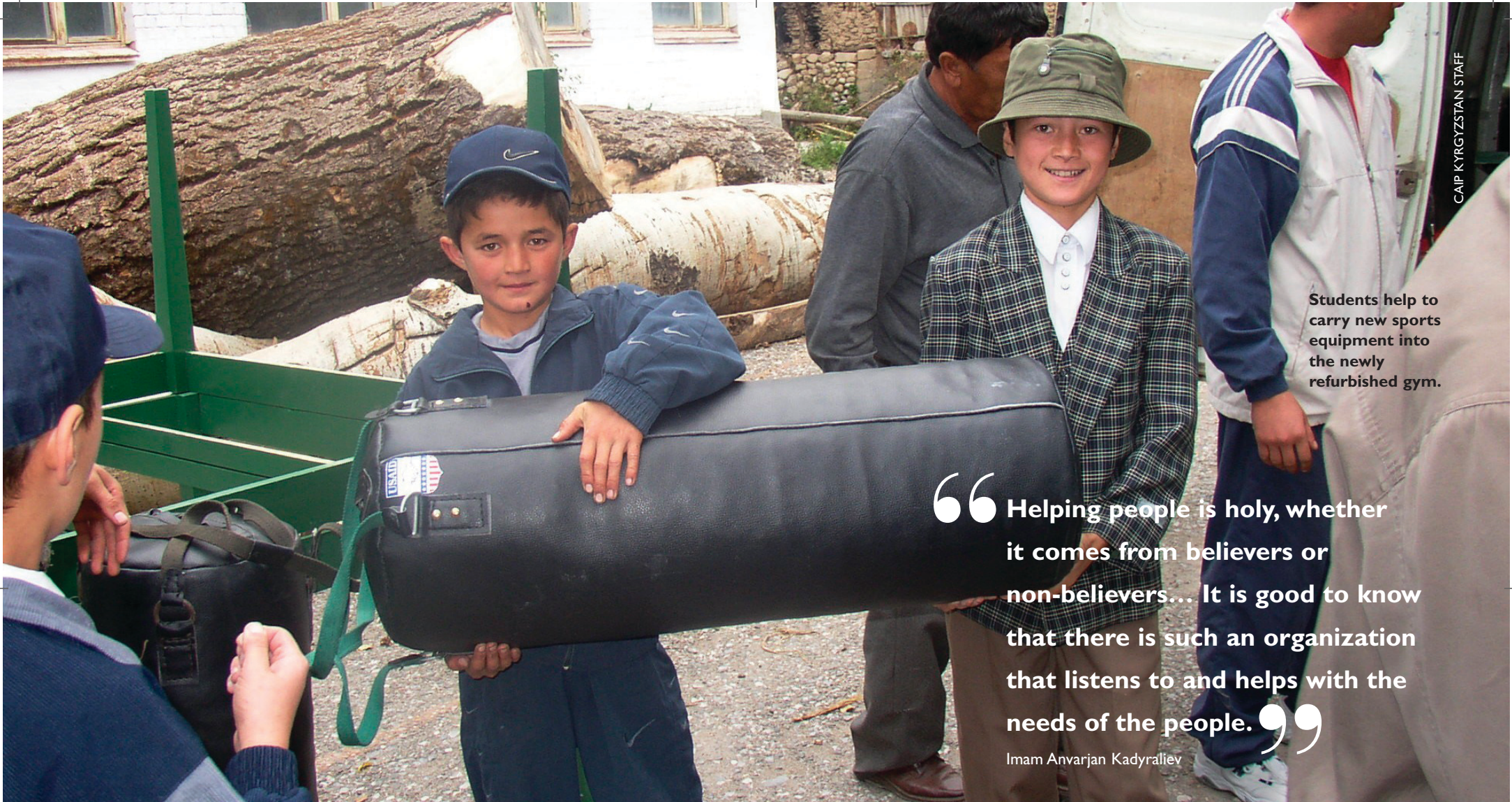

IMAM HELPS SUPPORT INITIATIVE

Arslanbob is an ethnic Uzbek village in Kyrgyzstan. Due to its isolation and lack of opportunity for young people, the town had become a recruiting ground for the banned Hizb-ut-Tahrir.

USAID works in such situations to reduce tensions. Working with community leaders there, it was decided to refurbish the local gym in order to provide a healthy outlet for the youth. However, no one was sure how to approach the local Imam, whose

support was critical. The Imam was so impressed with the concept, however, that he committed \$1,500 in weekly mosque contributions to the community's next project.

FOOD FOR BOLIVIAN STUDENTS

Many poor children in Bolivia depend on the food they receive at school for their only reliable meal of the day. Today, more than 584,000 students—almost half Bolivia's public school enrollment—benefit from this system.

By including bananas and passion fruit in the school meals, USAID has added important nutrients to the students' diets and provided a reliable source of income for thousands of farmers who have renounced coca production and supply the schools 100 metric tons of bananas and passion fruit every week.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Rural parts of Romania's Sibiu County have little access to hospitals and ambulance service. USAID is helping address the need for the latter by funding emergency crews in two local firefighting departments.

The program trains firefighters to use specialized equipment and give emergency care before an ambulance can arrive. One team is equipped to international standards, giving a cardiac arrest case from the countryside the same chance of survival an urban case has. The team also responds to traffic accidents and provides first aid until an ambulance comes and patients can be taken to the hospital.
