Commercial Applications

Centralized Mail Delivery provides delivery and collection services for a number of business customers from a convenient central location.

Benefits to developers, builders, and owners who use Centralized Mail Delivery, in innovative installations such as the ones depicted, include:

Increased Security: Centralized Mail Delivery installations provide a greater degree of protection against mail theft and mailbox vandalism than unlocked mailboxes.

Additional Postal Services: Centralized Mail Delivery installations can provide additional services for residents, such as postage stamp vending machines, parcel delivery equipment, and letter collection boxes.

Other Advantages: Centralized Mail Delivery installations eliminate the need for business customers to be present during service hours, or to maintain wall-mounted mailboxes or door delivery slots (often prohibited by local fire codes).



Centralized Installations

Commercial Delivery Centers:

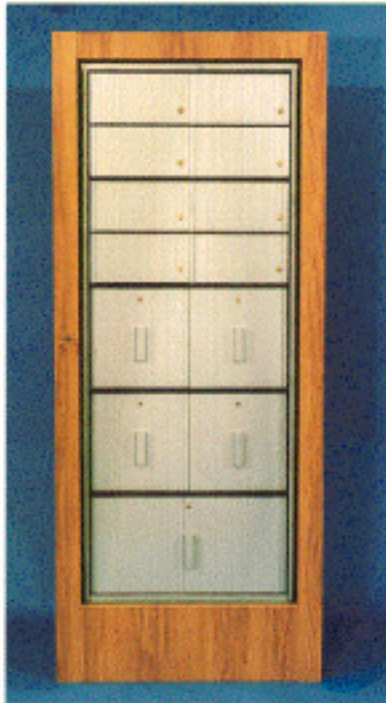
A free-standing, sheltered or enclosed installation containing a large number of individually locked, wall-mounted mailboxes.

Cluster Box Units (CBUs):

Free-standing, pedestal-mounted installations containing 8, 12, 13, or 16 individually locked mail boxes and parcel compartments. Innovative customized installations are depicted below.

Mailroom: A centralized delivery installation intended for office buildings and shopping malls. Mailroom installations can include a call window, served during specified hours by a Postal Service employee, as well as parcel lockers and vending equipment. Mailroom installations offer the opportunity to achieve a "mini-post office" within an office building.

Although planning for basic or customized Centralized Mail Delivery installations for business customers should take place during a project's design phase, the Postal Service is anxious to work with developers, builders, and owners at any stage of development.
