Entry Guidelines

An entry for the contest must consist of an original drawing and text. It must also include the author's first name (no last names please on the original) and their grade in school. **All entries must have attached a completed parental permission form (see next page).**

Grades 1-2 (1st place to be made into free GNHA postcards)

The original drawing and text must fill an 8 ½ X 11 sheet of unlined, white paper, and be made with crayons or markers (no colored pencils please). Text underneath the drawing must form a complete thought, be **at least two sentences long**, and relate to the contest theme, “What Does Glacier National Park Mean to Me?”

Grades 3-5 (1st place to be made into free GNHA postcards)

The original drawing and text must fill an 8 ½ X 11 sheet of unlined, white paper, and made with crayons or markers (no colored pencils please). Text underneath the drawing must form a complete thought, be **at least one paragraph (5 sentences) long**, and relate to the contest theme, “What Does Glacier National Park Mean to Me?”

Grades 6-8 (1st place to be made into free GNHA postcards)

The original drawing and poem must fill an 8 ½ X 11 sheet of unlined, white paper and be made with ink or markers (no colored pencils please). The drawing should portray a Glacier scene or animal/plant that you have learned about and that relates to the contest theme, “What Does Glacier National Park Mean to Me?” **An original poem** that clearly relates to the drawing needs to accompany the picture.

Please have entries **post-marked by 10/26/2007**, and sent to: Wendy Hill, Student Contest, Glacier Natural History Association, P.O. Box 310, West Glacier, MT 59936.

Winners will be announced by 11/30/2007.

All entries will be judged on: fulfillment of the guidelines listed above, originality, neatness, grammar, spelling, use of color, accuracy to Glacier's ecosystem, and clear evidence in the entry of the author's knowledge of Glacier.
