[PRIVATE—No. 687.]

An act granting a pension to Henry Alward, dependent father of Henry M. Alward.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to place on the pension-roll the name of Henry Alward, dependent father of Henry M. Alward, deceased, late a private of Company H, Fortieth Regiment Indiana Volunteer Infantry, according to the provisions and limitations of the pension laws.

Approved, September 6, 1888.

will observe and obey the orders of the President of the United States, and the orders of the officers ap-
pointed over me, according to the Rules and Articles of War.

personally appeared before me Thomas B. Brown Clerk of a Court of Record within
and for the County and State aforesaid Henry Alwood, a resident of
Waukegan in the County of Montgomery and State of Indiana,
and whose post office address is Waukegan, Indiana, aged 78
years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain
the benefit of the provisions made by the Act of Congress, approved June 6, 1866: That he is the father of
Henry M. Alwood who enlisted in the service of the United States at
Waukegan in the State of Indiana on the 17th
day of September 1862, as a Private in Company H, commanded by
Captain Alfred Cole in the 40th Regiment of Indiana vols.
in the war of 1861;

who while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, at Murfreesboro, Tennessee
died in the 18th day of April, 1863, from some kind of fever
in Hospital at Murfreesboro in the State of Tennessee on the 18 day of
April A. D., 1863. He further declares that his said son, upon whom he was wholly or
in part dependent for support, left no widow or minor child under sixteen years of age surviving; that he is unable
to support himself by reason of infirmity and old age

~~and has no personal property worth about \$250.00~~
and has no property other than as follows, to-wit: a house and two acres of land worth
\$700.00 and personal property worth about \$250.00
declarant makes this application for a Pension under the above mentioned act, and refers to the evidence filed herewith,
and that in the proper departments to establish his claim.

He also declares that he has not, in any manner, been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United
States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under the act above mentioned, or under any other act.

He hereby appoints Warren W. Vochter of Indiana State of
Indiana his true and lawful Attorney, with full power of substitution to prosecute this claim for pension
and to receive the certificate which may be issued therefor.
