General Order No. 143

II. At a General Court Martial which convened at the Head Quarters 1st Division, 14th Army Corps, on the 6th day of May 1863, pursuant to Special Order No. 63 from Head Quarters 1st Division, 14th Army Corps, and of which Thos. G. E. S. Watts, 2nd Ky. Cavalry is President, was arraigned and tried Private David Glazer, of the 4th Indiana Patteny, on the following charge and specification:

Charge. — Desertion in face of the enemy.

Specification. — In this that he, the said Private David Glazer, of the 4th Indiana Patteny, being duly enlisted in the service of the United States, did absent himself, without authority, from said service and from his company, at or near Liberty, Penn., on or about the 24th day of April, 1863, while in the immediate presence of the enemy, and remained

wearing the ordinary dress of a Rebel soldier, and represented himself as belonging to Morgan's Cavalry.

To which charge no Specification the accused pledged as follows:

To the Specification. - "Not Guilty"

To the Charge. - "Not Guilty"

Findings of the Court:

Of the Specification. - Guilty

Of the Charge - - - Guilty

Sentence - and the Court do therefore sentence him, the said David Blazer, Private of the 4th Indiana Battery, to be shot to death at such time and place as the commanding General shall direct - Two-thirds of the members of the Court concurring therein.

III The General Commanding approves the finding and sentence of the Court.

The sentence will be carried into execution under the direction of Major General Rousseau, on Saturday the 20th day of June 1863, between the hours of 10 A.M.
and 12 M.

NOTE 1.—Two of these certificates (or duplicates) are to be given to each Volunteer Soldier or drafted man who may be discharged previously to the discharge of his company, that he may at once receive from the Paymaster the pay, &c., due him, and the captain or other COMMISSIONED officer commanding the company will certify to the act of the delivery of the duplicate certificate; on these certificates the Soldier is "entitled to" his *discharge*, and should also present his discharge to the Paymaster to have the payment endorsed on it. The discharge is to be given back to the Soldier by the Paymaster; the latter only retaining as his voucher the duplicate certificates.

NOTE 2.—If the Soldier is entitled to pay for the use of his horse, the Company Commander will certify to that fact on the back of both these final statements, and also to the time he has pay due for having been so mounted on his own horse.

NOTE 3.—When a Soldier is furnished with final statements, his descriptive list, if he has one, should be taken up by the officer who gives the Soldier these statements, and endorsed with a statement to this effect by the officer. This endorsement should exhibit a full statement of the time for which the Soldier was allowed pay on his final statements, the clothing account, and all other charges against him or in his favor, so as to comprise a complete exhibit of his account. It will then be transmitted to the company commander of the Soldier, who will enter all the data necessary to a full understanding of the Soldier's account on the muster roll upon which the Soldier's discharge is reported. The descriptive list will then be destroyed. The object of this is, that the remaining portion of the Soldier's account may be settled upon the receipt of these muster rolls, and the Soldier receive any pay or allowances that may be due him at the time of his discharge, and which may not appear on his final statements from the fact that his descriptive list is incomplete. These accounts for back pay, &c., are settled by the 2d Auditor of the Treasury Department.

NOTE 4.—Charges for loss or injury to ordnance, horse equipments, and other miscellaneous charges, should appear under the heading of "Other Stoppages."

NOTE 5.—Bounty paid by State authorities, and not by the United States, will not be entered on this statement.

NOTE 6.—Amounts due the Sutler and Laundress must be entered on the muster roll on which the discharge, death, desertion, &c., is reported, as well as on the final statement, otherwise the amount cannot be collected from the United States.

NOTE 7.—This blank will be used for deceased volunteers and drafted men, as well as for others.

NOTE 8.—Where a Soldier dies in Hospital or on detached service, his descriptive list, if he has one, should be sent with his final statements, in duplicate, to the Second Auditor, Washington, D. C.

DAVID (name spellings in records: Blasser, Blazer); Civil War - Union; served in 4 Indiana Light Artillery Company (also known as 4 Indiana Battery); born 1841 at Columbus, OH; before service lived in Delaware County, OH; mustered in 2-18-1863 at Nashville, Davidson County, TN; served as a private; height 5'8", dark complexion, grey eyes, dark hair; a farmer; 4-24-1863 deserted near Liberty, TN; 4-29-1863 captured by a Union Cavalry patrol near Alexandria, TN; 6-19-1863 tried by a General Court Martial, at Murfreesboro, TN; executed 11:50 a.m., 6-20-1863, at Murfreesboro, TN; buried M-5248, Stone's River National Cemetery, Murfreesboro, TN (original interment was at Murfreesboro, TN); no details of engagements or other military history has been found.

In a General Court Martial which convened at the Head Quarters 1st Division 14th Army Corps, on the 6th day of May 1863, pursuant to Special Order No. 69 from Head Quarters 1st Division, 14th Army Corps, and of which Dr. G. E. S. Watts, 1st Regt. Cavalry is President, was arraigned and tried Private David Glazier, the 4th Indiana Cavalry, on the following charge and specification:

Charge. - Deserter in face of the enemy.

Specification. - In this that he the said David Glazier, of the 4th Indiana Cavalry, who is duly enlisted in the service of the United States, did abscon him self, without authority, from said service and from his company, at or near Liberty, Tenn., on about the 24th day of April, 1863, while in the immediate presence of the enemy, and remained absent until captured at or near Alexandria, Tenn., on or about the 29th day of April, 1863, by a force of United States Cavalry, and was then captured.

wearing the ordinary dress of a Rebel soldier, and represented himself as belonging to Morgan's Cavalry.

To which charge & Specification the accused pled as follows:




