Dear Mrs. Cook,

Thank you for the tour at The Stones River National Battlefield. It was informational.

I'm enclosing more information about Anderson Chance (my great grandfather).

According to the 1850 Sevier Co. Census, Anderson Chance was a son of Samuel and Juda Chance. He was born on Oct. 10, 1829 in Richmond Co. N.C. He evidently came to Sevier Co. Tenn. in early childhood. Anderson Chance married Margaret Lawson on Aug. 17, 1852. Five children were born to this union.

Judy, Caldonia Chance Stott (my grandmother, thought she was six or seven when her father Anderson Chance put his gun across his shoulder, walked across the lowlands, climbed a steep hill and entered the woodlands. That was the last time she saw her father. He was making his way to Sevierville to join Company "M" that was being formed by Capt. Robert A. Montgomery and Elkanah W. Wynn on Nov. 8, 1862.

Anderson Chance was promoted to Sergeant on March, 1863 by Capt. Montgomery. He died from typhoid fever on July 14, 1863 in Field Hospital at Murfreesboro.

Mrs. Stott said that food was very scarce during the Civil War. She felt that malnutrition contributed to her younger sister's death.

The Southern Soldiers were camped near their home. Mrs. Margaret Chance kept the food hid in a bush pile some distance from the house. Under the cover of night, she put on a pair of men's shoes and made her way to the food supply.

Mrs. Chance raised her family near Pigeon Forge, Tenn. She supported them by weaving cloth and sewing for the community. Her speciality was tailoring linsey men suits. The government pension was \$8.00 per month. Later it increased some.

I'm enclosing a self addressed envelope. I'd appreciate any information that you have on Caleb Chance. His parents were Samuel and Jeda Chance. He was born in N. C. Caleb Chance was 14 when the 1850 Sevier Co. Census was taken. He married Nancy Ann Clabo on July 14, 1859.

Some one told the family about seeing
him during the Battle of Murfreesboro.
He had been wounded and was
leaning against a tree.

Nancy Ann Clabo Chance received
a pension.
