Curtis Knox, he says, is missing. He may be taken prisoner, perhaps.

Lt. D. says. "Lost in our company, 22, four wounded, do not know many killed."

He says: "We left Nashville the 26th of Dec. and fought Hardee, on the Bowlingville Pike, two days before we arrived here. Last Tuesday the fight commenced here. We fought them for five days, and for three days nothing could be heard but the deafening sound of cannon. I do not know how I escaped so well, I am not hurt yet, but the front of my hat was carried away by a musket ball. We have fought over about eight miles square, four times. Our brigade was ordered to make a bayonet charge about 3 o'clock in the afternoon. We made a grand charge and routed the enemy. Our army is quiet to-day. We have a great many prisoners. Our dead are all buried, and our wounded all taken good care of. I think this afternoon or to-morrow will determine the battle. We will not leave here until we take the place. I will write again as soon as the battle is over."
