DECLARATION FOR INVALID ARMY PENSION.

STATE OF Indiana
COUNTY OF Jefferson } SS:

On this 6th day of September, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty 6, personally appeared before me, Dana G Phillips, Clerk of the Circuit Court, within and for the County and State aforesaid, Jonathan

Eades aged 37 years, a resident of Madison, in the County of Jefferson, in the State of Indiana, who, being duly sworn, according to law, declares that he is the identical Jonathan Eades, who enlisted in the service of the United States at Madison, County of Jefferson, State of Indiana, on the 10 day of August, in the year 1861, as a Private in Company d, commanded by Captain Samuel Russell, in the 6th Regiment of Indiana Infantry Volunteers, in the war of 1861,

and on discharge then was enlisted on 5 day of October 1863 as a Private in Company A of 120 Regiment of Indiana Inf Volunteers and was honorably discharged on the 9th day of February, in the year 1866; that while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, at a place called Murphytown, in the State of Tennessee, on the 31st day of December, 1862, in battle

he received a gun shot wound in the left leg between the knee and the ankle a canister shot passing through said leg he was sent in two or three days to Hospital No 6 in Nashville Tennessee when he remained about 4 days when he was sent to Indianapolis Indiana to City Hospital when he remained about two months when he started to his regiment and in Nashville was put in Hospital No 8 and after remaining there nearly two months was transferred to Hospital No 13 Sam City from which he was discharged

Since leaving the service he has resided at Madison in the County of Jefferson, in the State of Indiana and his occupation has been a Laborer

when enrolled he was a Laborer And for the purpose of prosecuting his claim, he hereby appoints John Roberts, of Madison State of Indiana, his attorney in fact, with power of substitution, and with authority to receive his pension certificate. He requests that his pension be paid at Madison State of Indiana His Post Office address is Madison County of Jefferson, and State of Indiana
