That she is the widow of Harry Large, who was a Private in Company E, commanded by Captain John Henry, in the 2^d Regiment of New York Volunteers, commanded by W. C. Daniel & H. W. Head, in the war of 1861. (3) That her said husband died at Abbeville, in the State of Virginia, on the 34th day of March A. D. 1863 (4) with the disease of Typhoid Fever, as aforesaid, having been suffered by reason of his service in the same company, and soon after his death, while in the line of duty in the service of the United States.

She further declares that she was married to the said Harry Large, at her former residence, on the day of

A. D. 1841, by one James Thaxter, a Justice of the Peace; that her name before her marriage was Eliza M. Mendenhall, and that ever since the death of her said husband, she has remained a widow, as will more fully appear by reference to the proof annexed. That during the existence of the aforesaid marriage there were born to her and her said husband the following named children, who are now under the age of sixteen years, viz:
