Va. and West, in the county of Marion, and State of West Virginia, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862: (2)

That she is the widow of Henry Large, who was a Private in Company E, commanded by Captain John Henry, in the 2d Regiment of West Virginia Volunteers, commanded by Col. Daniel M. Rhea, in the war of 1861. (3)

That her said husband died at Ball's Crossroads, in the State of West Virginia, on the 5th day of March A. D. 1863 with the disease of Typhoid Fever, as applicant has been informed by persons serving the same company, and seen him after his death while in the line of duty in the service of the United States.

She further declares that she was married to the said Henry Large at her father's house, on the 1st day of June A. D., 1861, by one James Baxter, a justice of the peace; that her name before her marriage was Laura Memmahan, and that ever since the death of her said husband, she has remained a widow; as will more fully appear by reference to the proof annexed.
