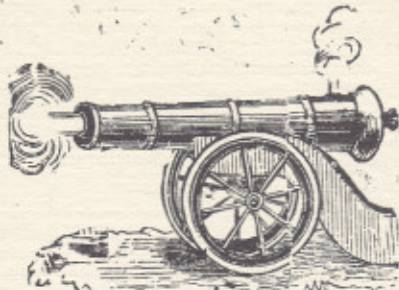

two to serve the war is hereby

Honorably Discharged from the Army of the Confederate States,
HAVING REMAINED TRUE TO HIS COLORS TO THE LAST.

listed a farmer
