The 19th Regiment South Carolina Infantry was composed of ten companies, A to K, which were organized on various dates in November and December, 1861, for twelve months. The regiment was re-organized for the war in May, 1862, and accordingly consolidated with the 20th Regiment South Carolina Infantry on January 1, 1862. The companies, however, bear recognition of the consolidated organization but each company of the original organization was numbered separately. The 19th and the 20th Regiments South Carolina Infantry were again consolidated at Fort Walker, S. C., and formed the South Carolina Division of Infantry, 1st Division, the term of this regiment being twelve months, May 1, 1862, at Greenville, S. C., to Companies C to F of that regiment.

The 19th Regiment South Carolina Infantry was composed of two companies, A & B, which were organized on various dates in November and December, 1861, for 12 months service. The regiment was re-organized for duty in May, 1862, and temporarily associated with the 10th Regiment South Carolina Infantry about January 1, 1862, this regiment forming the composition of the consolidated organization for such company of the original organization was soon again separated. The 19th and the 10th Reg't South Carolina Infantry were again consolidated about April 1, 1862, and formed the South Carolina Division of Infantry. On May 22, 1862, the 19th Reg't was re-organized being finally placed May 1, 1862, as Companies A, B, C, & D, in Companies C & D of that location.
