This day I start writing a Short Biography of The Members of Co. K, afterwards "Co" "G" 8th Tennessee Infantry 1st Donaldson's Brigade, 2nd Wright's Brigade, 3rd Carter's Brigade. General Carter was Killed at Franklin, Tennessee, November 30, 1864.

Co, "K" afterwards "Co" "G" 8th Tennessee Infantry was organized at Gainesboro, Tennessee about May 6th, 1861.

The officers and promotion of Privates follow:

Capt. Wm Gore of Gainesboro, Tennessee Elected R.J.C. Gailbreath. Capt. Gore Commanded The "Co" in The Battle at The Crouch house and Beckeys Run in The Rear, of Chat Mt. Virginia and The Battle of Post Royal Ferry, South Carolina and Commanded as an Artillery "Co" at Ben Creek, South Carolina a Sixes Battery.

Capt. Gore remained with us until The Passage of The Couscript Law which took affect about the 1st of May 1862. He retired from Military

Life to Gainesboro and was Elected to The Lower House of The Tennessee Legislature which was to assemble at Memphis, Tennessee. He had this

position until he was Promoted to Lieutenant in Hamilton's command afterward Shaws Batallion. Later Commanded by Capt. Wright. Many

Capt. Gore was paroled at Washington, Ga., May 9th, 1865 as one of President Davis' escort and Returned to Private Life at Gainesboro.

Lieutenant A.B. Botts, a Citizen of Gainesboro, Tenn. was Elected 1st Lieutenant. Served until The Passage of The Couscript Law. He came home and Renewed his Citizenship at Gainesboro.

Moved to Glasgo, Kentucky with his Brother, Wm H. Botts where he died after the war.

Lieutenant ^{James Eaton} ~~A.B.~~ Botts, a Citizen of Gainesboro, Tenn., was Elected 2nd Lieutenant and Served until after The Chat Mt. Campague in Va. On account of All health he resigned. ^{Returned to Gainesboro he afterwards} ~~He returned to Gainesboro and as~~ I understand he Accompanied Col. Hamilton on Some of his Raids into Ky. and It was also told of him That he had a tustle with a Yankee at Shattersburg. The Yankee taking a fine Colts Rifle from him. He gave it up with The understanding that the Yankee would not make him a prisoner.

Soon after he took ^{the} oath of Allegiance and returned to citizenship.

3rd Lieutenant A.W.W. Brooks, ⁺ The Circuit Clerk of Jackson Co., Tennessee, was ⁺ Elected 3rd Lieutenant and was in all of ⁺ The Battles and Skirmishes until ⁺ The Passage of ⁺ The Couscript Law.

When he resigned, ⁺ was Elected 2nd Lieutenant in 4th Tennessee Cav. - Where he Served galantly until ⁺ The Close of ⁺ The War and was ⁺ Paroled as one of President Davis' ⁺ Escort in ⁺ June. ⁺ Dibreles Brigade at Washington, Georgia on 9th day of May, 1865.

1st Sergeant David M. Hale, a young Lawyer of Merit and ⁺ Distinction, was ⁺ Elected O.S. on about ^{6th day of May} ~~the~~ 1861. Which ⁺ Position he filled with Credit to himself ⁺ Distinction to ⁺ The "Co" until ⁺ The Couscript Law took affect ⁺ When he was ⁺ Elected 2nd Lieutenant of ⁺ The "Co". Where he Served galantly until ⁺ The Battle of Murfreesboro where he was ⁺ Killed on ⁺ ~~the~~ 31st ^{Dec} December, 1862.

2nd Sergt. Tecumpsey Gore Settle, a merchant in Gainesboro, Tenn. Prior to 1861 was ⁺ Elected 2nd Sergt. ~~and~~ Served galantly in all ⁺ The Battles ⁺ and Skirmishes until he was discharged ⁺ Some Months after ⁺ The ^{re organization} ~~organization~~ of the "Co" for ^{ph. s. cal} Real Disability. On ⁺ Returning home he attached himself to Col. Hamiltons ⁺ Batalliou. During ⁺ The War ⁺ Serving ⁺ on ⁺ ~~various~~ Raids in Kentucky his health ⁺ permitting. He was ⁺ Big Hearted ⁺ ~~Career~~ ^{clever} fellow and we all liked him both in ⁺ and out of ⁺ The War. He belonged to S.S. Bivouac at Gainesboro, Tennessee.

3rd Sergt. Licurgus ⁺ ~~of~~ ⁺ Gipson of Gainesboro, Tenn. was ⁺ Elected 3rd Sergt. of ⁺ The "Co" and on ⁺ Passage of ⁺ The Couscript Law he went ⁺ Back to ⁺ The Ranks Where he fought in all ⁺ The Battles in Which ⁺ The "Co" and ⁺ ~~the~~ ⁺ ~~the~~ were ⁺ Engaged until ⁺ The Close of ⁺ The War.

For Bravery, Moral Worth, ⁺ and ⁺ Intergrity he had no ⁺ ~~superior~~ ^{superior} ⁺ Should I undertake to write him up as a soldier and his ⁺ Brave and good Deeds ⁺ During ⁺ The War I would have to ⁺ neglect others ⁺ Equally ⁺ Entitled. L.M. Gipson was ⁺ Paroled with his "Co" at ⁺ ~~Grusboro~~ ^{Greensboro}, North Carolina April, 1865.

4th Sergt Barley P. McClallard, a ^{e n} Citizen of Gainesboro, Served honorably until ⁺ The Couscript Law went into ⁺ Affect he ⁺ Then Returned to ⁺ Citizenship. He was ⁺ Elected 4th Sergt. about 6th ⁺ Day of May, 1861 at 1st organization of ⁺ The "Co".

5th Sergt. Lipton C. Settle was ⁺ Elected 5th Sergt. at Gainesboro at 1st organization of ⁺ The "Co" and ⁺ Until a Short time after ⁺ The Couscript Law went into ⁺ Affect. When he was honorably ⁺ Discharged for ⁺ Physical Disability and returned to ⁺ Citizenship.

1st Corporal John Hanhooser was Elected 1st Corporal about 6th day of May, 1861. Served Honorably until The Couscript Law. He was Honorably Discharged as under age ~~The~~ age Limit being 18 years. He soon Joined Shaws Battalliou of Cavalry and served Honorably until he surrendered as one of Pres. Co. Escort on 9th day of May 1865

2nd Corporal Solomon Lenard Hall was Elected 2nd Corporal at organization. Served galantly until ~~The~~ Reorganization at Corinth Miss when he returned to the ranks and among the bravest of the brave was killed on 31st Dec., 1862 at Mursfreesboro. He was absolutely a clean man and certainly had no suprior in either civil or military life.

3rd Corporal George M. Ray Sherriff of Jackson County was elected 3rd Corporal and served honorably until Discharged under The Couscript Law also age George Ray was a strong hearted clever fellow and had many friends in both civil and military life.

4th Corporal Joseph Leipshuts, a Jew from Bavania was elected 4th Corporal at organization of the Company and served honorably until after the Murfreesboro Battle. At the Reorganization of the "Co" he was elected 2nd Lieut. He signally distinguished himself upon various battlefields. He was promoted to agt of ~~The Ryer~~ ^{Regt} and signally distinguished himself at the Battle of Franklin. Later at night when he was shot and killed at works. No man was entitled to more credit for bravery, moral worth, and integrity than Joseph Leipshuts the Jew from Bavanis. He was a scholar at home and soon took on our ~~another~~ Language and Applied Education in every respect he was scrupulously honest, honorable and reliable and was capable of any position to which he might be called. ^{seemingly}

1st Musician Napolian B. Young was made musicians of ~~the Ryer~~ ^{Regt} and served until the ^{Perryville} Battle on going unto the Battle Pole called to the Col. saying Col. what must I do the Col. answer take that Drum and get to the rear.
