AN INITIAL DETERMINATION GRANTING MOTIONS TO TERMINATE THE  
INVESTIGATION WITH RESPECT TO ONE PATENT**

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 7) granting motions to terminate the investigation with respect to U.S. Patent No. 6,509,414 (“the ‘414 patent”).

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** This investigation was instituted on November 12, 2008, based upon a complaint filed on behalf of Isola USA Corp. of Chandler, Arizona (“Isola”) on October 6, 2008, and supplemented on October 28, 2008. *73 Fed. Reg.* 66919 (November 12, 2008). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain prepregs, laminates, and finished circuit boards that infringe certain claims of United States Patent Nos. 6,187,852; 6,322,885; and the ‘414 patent. The notice of investigation named seven firms as respondents.

On December 22, 2008, the Commission issued notices of its determinations not to review ID's terminating the investigation with respect to respondents Sanmina-SCI Corp. and ITEQ Corp. based on settlement agreements.

On December 8, 2008, respondent Guangdong Sci. Tech. Co., Ltd. ("Shengyi") filed a motion to terminate the investigation as to Shengyi with respect to the '414 patent pursuant to Commission Rule 210.21(a)(1), 19 C.F.R. § 210.21(a)(1). On December 10, 2008, respondents VENTEC Electronics (Suzhou) Co., Ltd.; VENTEC Electronics (HK) Co., Ltd.; and VENTEC-Global Laminates USA LLC filed a motion to terminate along with a notice of reliance on Shengyi's motion. On December 12, 2008, respondent Taiwan Union Technology Corp. also filed a motion to terminate and notice of reliance on Shengyi's motion. On December 12, 2008, the Commission investigation attorney filed a response in support of the motions. On December 18 and 19, 2008, complainant Isola filed responses to the motions of the various respondents. On December 22, 2008, the ALJ issued the subject ID, granting the motions to terminate the investigation with respect to the '414 patent. No petitions for review were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID.

This action is taken under the authority of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and of section 210.42(h) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR § 210.42(h)).
