Subject: Tree Thinning

Jen,

Just got your message asking about tree thinning (or the Wildfire Hazard Reduction Project, as it is officially known). There are actually four reports (that I know of) generated from the undertaking. Two are reports by Brad listing the sites we flagged/found/etc. during the initial surveys (LA-CP-02-0378 and LA-CP-03-0455). The two other reports (one by myself, one by myself and Kari) are site recording reports of new sites found during the survey (one is LA-CP-04-0766, the other is still working its way through the system). Also note that several new tree thinning sites were in areas of other projects and so are recorded in those projects' reports.

The official count of the number of new sites found (after we eliminated--to the best of our abilities-- duplicates, sites with previously assigned LA numbers, etc.) is 447. During the course of recording we have found some of these sites to be natural features, others to be duplicates, etc.
