Cumulative Impacts: The CEQ regulations implementing NEPA define cumulative effects as impacts on the environment that result from the action when added to other past, present, and reasonably foreseeable future actions, regardless of what agency or person undertakes such other actions (40 CFR 1508.7). The regulations further explain that “cumulative effects can result from individually minor but collectively significant actions taking place over a period of time.” The cumulative impacts assessment is based on both geographic (spatial) and time (temporal) considerations.
