Issues Discussed: Impact of smoke from the Cerro Grande fire on livestock

Resolution: This conversation was in response to a public comment (number 734-1) on the June 2006 draft LANL SWEIS. The commenter asserted that "...right after the Los Alamos fire, there were aberrations in animal birth, goats, chickens, and horses..." in Ojo Sarco, Sapello and Gallinas. Dr. Taylor, Director of Veterinary Diagnostic Services for the NM Department of Agriculture said that he had never heard anything like that, and that his department had never been asked to investigate any livestock health problems that might have been associated with smoke from the Cerro Grande fire.
