11	We will turn to the minutes of March 15,
12	2005, (2 sets) and Ratification List 05-006. Are
13	there any objections to approval of the minutes or the
14	ratification list?

16	CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Hearing none, they are
17	approved.
18	I want to say good morning to Vice Chairman
19	Okun and Commissioner Miller, who I understand are
20	voting by telephone today.
21	VICE CHAIRMAN OKUN: Good morning.
22	COMMISSIONER MILLER: Good morning.
23	CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: We will now turn to the
24	briefing and vote in Investigation Nos. 731-TA-1071
25	and 1072 (Final), Magnesium From China and Russia.

1	Good morning, Mr. Deyman.
2	Are there any questions for the staff?
3	(No response.)
4	CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Are there any additions or
5	corrections to the staff report?
6	MR. DEYMAN: Yes, Mr. Chairman. I am George
7	Deyman, Office of Investigations.
8	We propose that the staff report be amended
9	to include the corrections contained in Office of
10	Investigations Memoranda INV-CC-034 of March 16, 2005,
11	and INV-CC-037 of March 21, 2005.
12	CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Thank you.
13	Are there any objections to approval of the
14	staff report as revised?
15	(No response.)
16	CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Hearing none, it is
17	approved.
18	Madam Secretary, will you please call the
19	roll?
20	MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Lane?
21	COMMISSIONER LANE: I make an affirmative
22	injury determination as to both investigations, and I
23	make a negative critical circumstances determination
24	regarding China.
25	MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Miller?

1	COMMISSIONER MILLER: I find granular
2	magnesium to be a separate like product and find
3	subject imports of granular magnesium from Russia to
4	be negligible.
5	I find all other pure and alloy magnesium to
6	be a single like product and make an affirmative
7	determination with respect to subject imports from
8	China and Russia.
9	I make a negative finding with respect to
10	critical circumstances.
11	MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Pearson?
12	COMMISSIONER PEARSON: I find one domestic
13	like product. I vote in the affirmative on these
14	investigations and negative with respect to critical
15	circumstances.
16	MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Okun?
17	VICE CHAIRMAN OKUN: I find one like product
18	consisting of pure and alloy magnesium. I vote in the
19	affirmative with respect to these investigations, and
20	I make a negative critical circumstance finding.
21	MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Hillman?
22	COMMISSIONER HILLMAN: I concur with
23	Commissioner Miller in finding granular magnesium to
24	be a separate like product and find subject imports of
25	granular magnesium from Russia to be negligible.

1	I find all other pure and alloy magnesium to
2	be a single like product and make an affirmative
3	determination with respect to imports from China and
4	Russia.
5	I make a negative determination with respect
6	to critical circumstances.
7	MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Koplan?
8	CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: I make an affirmative
9	determination with regard to both China and Russia. I
10	make a negative determination with regard to critical
11	circumstances as to China.
12	MS. ABBOTT: Mr. Chairman, the Commission
13	has reached affirmative determinations in these
14	investigations and has announced negative critical
15	circumstances.
16	CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Thank you, Madam
17	Secretary.
18	Further information regarding this
19	determination will be in the press release.
20	Commissioners' opinions are currently
21	scheduled to be transmitted to the Department of
22	Commerce on or before April 11, 2005.
23	Thank you to all staff who assisted us in
