11 COMMISSIONER MILLER: The first item on our  
12 agenda today are the agenda for future meetings and  
13 outstanding action jackets, and we have none to  
14 consider.

15 Secondly, we have the minutes of July 12,  
16 14, and 21, 2005, and Ratification List 05-017. Are  
17 there objections to approval?

18 (No response.)

19 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Hearing none, they are  
20 approved.

21 Next on our agenda today is Investigation  
22 No. 731-TA-1094 (Preliminary), Metal Calendar Slides  
23 From Japan.

24 Welcome to Ms. Mazur and the staff who have  
25 been handling this investigation.

3 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Are there additions or

20 TA-104-7 and AA-1921-198-200 (Second Review) Sugar  
21 From The European Union; Sugar From Belgium, France,  
22 and Germany.

23 Again welcome to Ms. Mazur and to the staff  
24 who have handled this investigation for the  
25 Commission.

3 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Are there additions or

15 contained in Investigations Memorandum CC-116, 117 and  
16 119.

17 COMMISSIONER MILLER: All right. Are there  
18 objections to approval of the staff report as revised?

20 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Hearing none, it is  
21 approved.

22 Madam Secretary, would you call the roll,  
23 please?

24 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Lane?

25 COMMISSIONER LANE: I vote in the negative.

2 COMMISSIONER PEARSON: I vote in the

4 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Koplan?

5 CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: I vote in the negative.

6 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Miller?

7 COMMISSIONER MILLER: I vote in the  
8 affirmative.

9 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Hillman?

10 COMMISSIONER HILLMAN: I vote in the  
11 negative.

12 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Okun?

13 VICE CHAIRMAN OKUN: I vote in the negative.

14 MS. ABBOTT: Madam Chairman, the Commission  
15 has reached negative determinations in these  
16 investigations.

17 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Further information  
18 regarding this determination will be in the press  
19 release. Commissioners' opinions are currently  
20 scheduled to be transmitted to the Department of  
21 Commerce on or before August 29, 2005.

22 Thank you to the staff who handled this  
23 investigation.

24 With that, Madam Secretary, is there any  
25 other business at this point?

1 MS. ABBOTT: No, Madam Chairman.

2 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Well, then let me say  
3 first of all thank you to Chairman Koplán and Vice  
4 Chairman Okun, if they can still hear me that is, for  
5 being absent today and letting me have the opportunity  
6 of chairing my last meeting as a Commissioner at the  
7 ITC. I chaired the first meeting, which was kind of  
8 unusual, and it's equally unusual to chair the last  
9 one.

10 Mr. Chairman in particular, I know you may  
11 be having trouble hearing me. I hope I don't cause  
12 you too much trouble by keeping you on the line a  
13 little bit longer, but last Friday did mark nine years  
14 for me here at the Commission.

15 When I came I didn't expect to be here for  
16 nine years. I came with less than a full term, but I  
17 was lucky enough frankly to stay a bit longer. I  
18 didn't expect to do so, but I did so because I really  
19 have enjoyed this job so very, very much.

20 CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Commissioner Miller, can  
21 you hear me?

22 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I  
23 can. Are you still there?

24 CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Yes.

25 COMMISSIONER MILLER: The plane hasn't taken

1 you away yet?

2 CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: I want to just say to you  
3 (inaudible) appropriate that you do that.

4 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Steve, I think you're  
5 going to have to hold on because we can't hear you.

6 CHAIRMAN KOPLAN: Is that right?

7 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Okay. Hold on a  
8 minute because I'm not quit done, all right?

9 I just want to say this job has been one  
10 that for me has been constantly a learning exercise.  
11 New skills, new industries, refining old skills as  
12 well, and it really has been wonderful. I hope I've  
13 given it half as much as it has given to me. If I  
14 have, then I leave here feeling quite good about it.

15 I want to express my appreciation to the  
16 permanent staff because in so many ways you watch  
17 Commissioners come and go, but you are at the core of  
18 this institution, and whether it accomplishes its  
19 mission is really because the staff does the job for  
20 us on a daily basis as you watch us come and go and  
21 hopefully do more good than harm along the way.

22 I've had a great team. I couldn't have done  
23 it without them. Elizabeth Ravesteign and Ann Ryder  
24 started with me on my very first day at the  
25 Commission, and they will be with me until my last

1 day. I am so indebted to them for giving me that  
2 continuity throughout.

3 I've had wonderful confidential assistants  
4 in Patty McHugh and Gayle Fralin, who many of you know  
5 have been with me for so many years, and a great group  
6 of lawyers, currently June Brown and Barbara Flaherty,  
7 but prior to this David Oliver and Kevin Furman, Eric  
8 Solomon for a little while and even at the very  
9 beginning of my time here a young Commission attorney  
10 named Shara Aranoff, who will now return to the  
11 Commission, and I wish her well and hope that she  
12 enjoys it as much as I have in my time here.

13 I hope I'll have a chance to say goodbye to  
14 a lot of folks, and I tend to do a lot of walking  
15 around the building in my last week here before Labor  
16 Day. That is all I have to say.

17 Because I have the gavel, Mr. Chairman, it  
18 even gives me the opportunity to bring this meeting to  
19 a close. I appreciate it, and the meeting is  
20 adjourned.
