- Cranberry Mountain Nature Center:** Open Thursdays through Mondays, 9:00 am to 4:30 pm beginning on 4/16/09.
- Highland Scenic Highway:** There are four scenic overlooks. Each area has a small accessible picnic shelter and restrooms. Camping is not permitted. The Highway is closed in the winter.
- Middle Mountain Cabins:** Three Cabins with sleeping quarters for 8 -10 people. Reservations are required. Season is from 04/01/09 – 12/12/09.
- Seneca Rocks Discovery Center:** The Discovery Center will open for the season on Friday, 05/01/09. It will be open Sunday – Monday and Thursday – Saturday from 9:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. The summer schedule will begin on Thursday, 05/21/09 and the Center will be open seven days a week through Labor Day 2009, with hours of 9:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

--Dates and Fees subject to change by each District Office.

--Fees shown are for the major recreation season when full services are provided. Some sites may be closed in winter months for administrative purposes or because of weather conditions. Please contact each District office for winter availability.

--Dump stations are located at Seneca Shadows and Stuart Campgrounds. Dump station fee for non-campers is \$6

--Reservations can be made for selected campground by calling the toll-free National Recreation Reservation Service at 877-444-6777. The TDD number is 877-833-6777. You may make a reservation over the Internet at www.Recreation.gov. Information you will need to tell the reservation agent is 1) where and when you wish to go; 2) how many are in your party; 3) what type of equipment you may be bringing; and 4) your credit card number. Reservations must be made 4 days in advance of your arrival and can be reserved 240 days ahead for individual sites and 360 days for group sites.

Life Guards are not provided in swim areas.

Development Levels

The "development level" of a National Forest campground measures the degree of facility development. The following is a general guide on what to expect from campgrounds at these different development levels.

- Very low level of development.** These campgrounds are walk-in only with no motorized access. No water or toilets are usually provided. Usually no fees are charged for use of these campgrounds. Most campgrounds in designated Wilderness areas are at this level of development
- Low level of development.** These campgrounds are usually accessible over primitive roads. The spacing of camp units is irregular, with some distance between campsites. Water and vault toilets may be provided. A fee may or may not be charged for use of these campgrounds.
- Moderate level of development.** These campgrounds are accessible by roads that are generally surfaced with gravel. Camp units are usually regularly spaced and usually can accommodate recreational vehicles. Facilities such as water and toilets are usually provided. A fee is usually charged for use of these campgrounds.
- High level of development.** These campgrounds are accessed via paved roads and usually have paved roads and trails within the area. Camp units are regularly spaced and can accommodate recreational vehicles. Larger campsites for multi-family groups are usually available. Shower houses and playground equipment may be present, as well as some interpretive programs. A fee is charged for use of these campgrounds.
- Very high level of development.** Beyond the facilities outlined in Level 4, these campgrounds may offer electrified units, battery chargers for electric motors, fish cleaning

stations, flush toilets, hot showers, interpretive programs and other developed facilities.
