

Successful deer hunters are required to report their harvest at one of the deer registration boxes located near Refuge entrance gates.

Hunters must wear blaze orange in accordance with State regulations.

Portable tree stands may be used during Refuge deer and turkey seasons. Stands may be left overnight and must be tagged with the hunters name, address, and phone number. Tree spikes are prohibited.

Using lights to locate animals on the Refuge is prohibited.

Dog training is not allowed.

Only hunters with a State handicapped hunting permit may use crossbows.

The harvesting of frogs and turtles is prohibited.

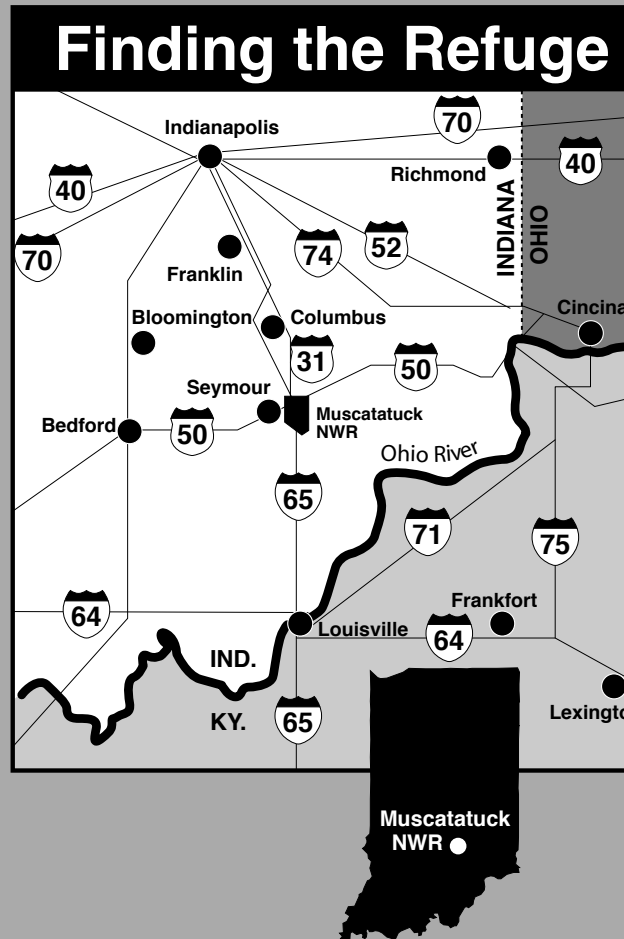

National Wildlife Refuge 2006-2007 Hunting Regulations



Muscatatuck National Wildlife Refuge General Hunt Permit 2006-07

This brochure contains hunting regulations that must be followed while hunting on Muscatatuck NWR. In addition to these conditions, State hunting regulations apply. This brochure must be signed and in the hunter's possession while on the Refuge.

All hunters are required to sign the front of this leaflet in the space provided indicating they have read and understand these regulations.

State hunting regulations apply to Muscatatuck subject to the following special conditions:

Hunting is allowed in designated areas only.

Refuge hours are normally sunrise to sunset. During the Refuge turkey season the Refuge opens 90 minutes before sunrise. During the Refuge deer season hours are 6 am to 6 pm.

Weapons may be possessed/transported on the Refuge only during Refuge hunting seasons. Firearms must be unloaded and cased or dismantled during transport.

Weapons may not be carried in "No Hunting Zones." Hunter parking is prohibited in "No Hunting Zones."

The discharge of firearms is prohibited within 100 yards of any building.

Shotguns and .22 caliber rimfire rifles are allowed for squirrel hunting.

Rabbit and quail may be hunted with shotgun only.

Hunting dogs may only be used for hunting rabbit and quail and must be under hunter control at all times.

Spring turkey hunting is only allowed by special permit. See State Hunting and Trapping Guide for details.

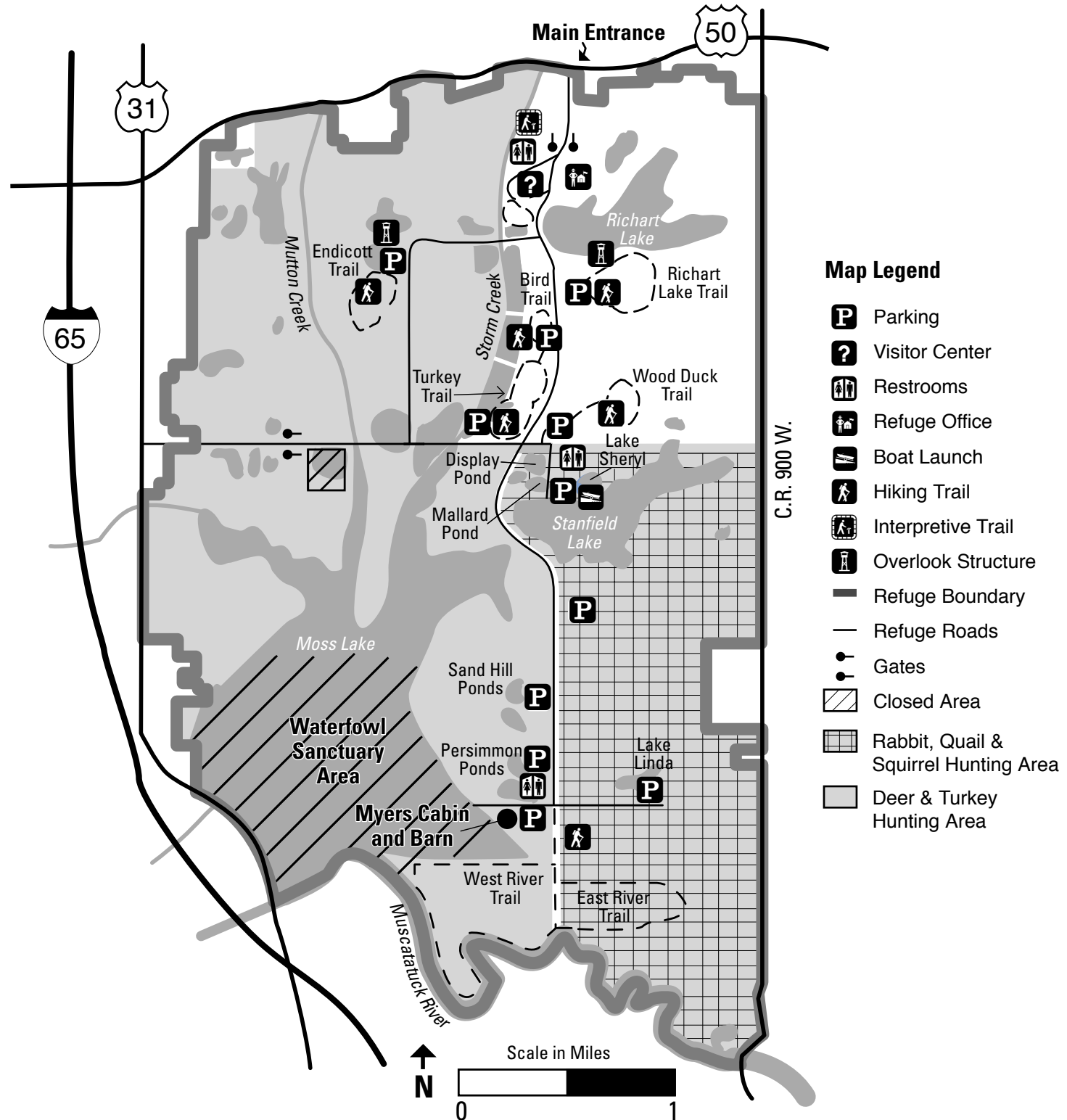
Rabbit, quail, and squirrel hunting is prohibited during the Refuge deer hunts.

The Refuge does not have an early archery season for deer hunting. Late archery season deer hunting is allowed.

Deer hunting is allowed by special permit only during muzzleloader season. See State Hunting and Trapping Guide for details.

Only one deer per day may be taken from the Refuge.

Hunters may retrieve deer from non-hunting areas of the Refuge if: (1) The hunter reports the location to Refuge staff. (2) The hunter enters the area without weapons. The Refuge "closed areas" are off-limits to all deer retrieval.
