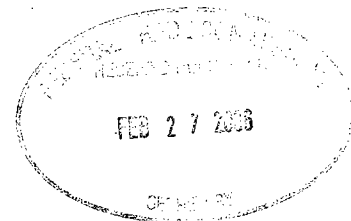



ORDER EXTENDING THE ONE YEAR DEADLINE

Commission Rule 3.51(a) requires that initial decisions be filed within one year following the issuance of the complaint, but allows the Administrative Law Judge to extend the one year deadline by an additional period of up to sixty days, upon a finding of extraordinary circumstances. 16 C.F.R. § 3.51(a). Such extension may be continued for additional consecutive periods of up to sixty days, provided that each additional period is based upon a finding by the Administrative Law Judge that extraordinary circumstances are still present. 16 C.F.R. § 3.51(a).

The one year deadline has been extended by Orders dated August 29, 2005, October 28, 2005, and December 29, 2005 to February 27, 2006. Trial is scheduled to commence on March 7, 2006. Accordingly, extraordinary circumstances are still present. The one year deadline is hereby extended to April 28, 2006.
