Dear Adrian:

I understand your concern regarding the change in material cost on fiberglass; however, the manufacturers are united in their price increases.

Enclosed are the announcements for the Owens Corning Fiberglas increases, beginning with the March 1, 1998 announcement. As you can see, the price changes already implemented represent a 28.31% increase for 1998. We will see an additional 9% increase on January 16, 1999, as all manufacturers are on allocation and lead times continue to increase.

<u>Be Aware!</u> Not all items manufactured in the past are available now. Owens Corning has deleted nearly one third of their product offerings (Certainteed, Manville & Knauf have followed suit).

I'm sorry for the problems this may cause, but the insulation manufacturers simply will not waver from their increases.
