





Overview of the New US Trustee requirements. The United States Trustee requests more data be collected to comply with the Bankruptcy Abuse Prevention and Consumer Protection Act of 2005. These reporting regulations are also known as BAPCPA. The data is collected at case opening and will be sent through the UST Daily Extraction file to the US Trustee data extraction program. The new information will not be sent to the Statistics Division. Click the button below to Continue.



When a Chapter 7 case is opened,



the new screen contains two sections. The first section comes from schedules C, I and J and will collect information from four fields. The second section collects data from the Form B22A Means Test.



The debtor or debtor's attorney enters information in the appropriate fields to satisfy the BAPCPA reporting requirements.



There are approximately thirty fields of data collected under the Form B22A section, some fields are optional depending on situation.





the new screen contains a check box used to collect the debtor's aggregated non-contingent liquidated debts shown on voluntary petition Form B1 and information from schedules C, I and J.



A new event is available to collect some of the required data for cases when this information is not available at case opening. The event is called Update EOUST Stats.



It should be used after an order for relief has been entered in an involuntary case, or for any case where the figures were not available when the case was opened. 
