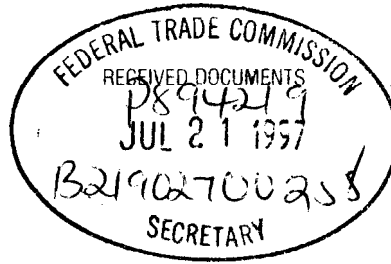

Vote NO for any statement that translates into less than 100% US made!

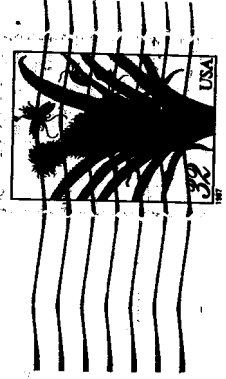
