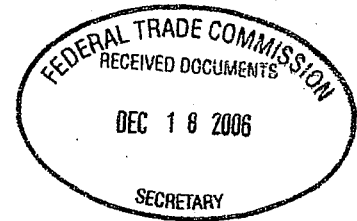

RE: Prerecorded Call Prohibition EBR Telemarketing, Project No. R411001

To whom it may concern:

I recently received a pre recorded phone call inviting me to a health fair and for a small fee I could get things like blood pressure, cholesterol. Thanks to this phone call I was instantly ask questions, get times and directions and ultimately I did attend this event.

I wish to oppose to the FTC's proposal that would require written authorization to receive pre-recorded telemarketing calls from the businesses and charities that I have an Established Business Relationship with. I am aware of the burden this would place on these businesses.

I would ask the Commission to either adopt the EBR exception contained in the TCPA that creates an exception for pre-recorded calls sent by companies that have an EBR with the person they are calling or continue its forbearance towards businesses that send pre-recorded messages to those with an EBR beyond January 2, 2007.
