Additional Staff Appointments Announced by the Administrator of National Nuclear Security Administration

Administrator John Gordon has announced additional top-level staff appointments for the U.S. Department of Energy's National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA).

"With these appointments, I am continuing to implement the organizational structure described in my report to the Congress on May 3, 2001, which is designed to improve the performance of our core mission," Gordon said. "These individuals will be directly responsible to the Associate Administrators for Facilities and Operations and Management and Administration and to my Management Council for the final organizational and staffing adjustments necessary to fully effect the NNSA reorganization by October 1, 2001."

The following managers will join Acting Associate Administrator Ralph Erickson in the Facilities and Operations organization:

Eric Schweitzer will be detailed as the Acting Director for Field Operations from his current position in Defense Programs; Capt. Bruce Scott, United States Navy, will be detailed as Acting Director, Infrastructure & Facilities Management from his current position in Defense Programs; James Mangeno will serve as the Acting Director of Safety and Health Operations in addition to his current role of Senior Advisor to the Administrator for Environment, Safety & Health; Willie Clark will be detailed as the Acting Director of Project Management and Engineering Support from his current position in Defense Programs. John Todd will continue to serve as the Director of Defense Nuclear Security and will serve as the Acting Director of the Office of Nuclear Safeguards and Security.

The following managers will join Acting Associate Administrator Anthony Lane in the Management and Administration organization:

Marc Hollander will be detailed as the Acting Chief Information Officer from his current position in Defense Programs. Hollander will be joined by Patrick Edgerton of Defense Programs, who will be detailed to assist in formulating Information Technology fiscal resource requirements and management practices. Bob Braden will continue to serve as the Director of the Office of Procurement and Assistance Management. Jay Cavanaugh will be detailed to serve as the Deputy Director for Procurement and Assistance Management from his current position in DOE's Procurement and Assistance Management Group. Ray F. Greenberg will be detailed as the Acting Deputy Director for Workforce Planning and Management Systems Implementation in the Office of Human Resources from his current position in Defense Programs. Roger Lewis will be detailed as Acting Director of Administrative Services from his current position as Associate Deputy Assistant Administrator in Defense Programs.

The Planning, Programming, Budgeting and Evaluation functions will be established under the acting joint leadership of Kate Foley, currently the Defense Programs Budget Director, and Jim Lambert, currently the Deputy Director for Resource Management in Defense Nuclear Nonproliferation Programs. Completing the Planning, Programming, Budgeting and Evaluation process implementation team will be Ken Sprankle of Defense Nuclear Nonproliferation Programs to serve in Program Analysis and Evaluation, and Sandy Haller, also of Defense Nuclear Nonproliferation Programs, who will serve in the budget function.

“While the difficult and detailed work to effect the reorganization moves toward full implementation by October 1, 2001, existing supervisory and organizational chains of command remain in effect,” Gordon said. “I have tasked the new team to move quickly in transitioning the NNSA enterprise into the proposed organization structure and I have called on all NNSA employees to support the team in this critical initiative.”
