OPENING STATEMENT OF JOHN T. CONWAY, CHAIRMAN OCTOBER 23, 2003, DOE OVERSIGHT

MY NAME IS JOHN CONWAY. I AM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE DEFENSE NUCLEAR FACILITIES SAFETY BOARD, AND I WILL PRESIDE OVER THE CONTINUATION OF THIS MEETING.

TODAY'S MEETING AND HEARING WERE PUBLICLY NOTICED IN THE FEDERAL REGISTER ON SEPTEMBER 26, 2003. THE MEETING AND HEARING ARE HELD OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT IN THE SUNSHINE ACT.

TODAY'S MEETING IS AN EXTENSION OF THE HEARINGS HELD ON SEPTEMBER 10 AND OCTOBER 21. IT CONSTITUTES THE THIRD IN A SERIES DURING WHICH THE BOARD IS EXAMINING THE DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY'S CURRENT AND PROPOSED MODELS OF SAFETY OVERSIGHT AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CONTRACTS AND CONTRACTORS IT RELIES UPON TO SAFELY ACCOMPLISH THE MISSION ASSIGNED TO DOE UNDER THE ATOMIC ENERGY ACT OF 1954, AS AMENDED. I WELCOME TODAY'S PRESENTER, MAJOR GENERAL JOHN L. BARRY, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE COLUMBIA ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION BOARD. THE BOARD ALSO WELCOMES MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC, MEMBERS OF THE PRESS IN OUR AUDIENCE, AND THOSE VIEWING OUR PROCEEDING ELECTRONICALLY.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BOARD'S PRACTICE, AND AS STATED IN THE FEDERAL
REGISTER NOTICE, WE WILL WELCOME COMMENTS FROM INTERESTED MEMBERS OF THE
PUBLIC AT THE CONCLUSION OF TESTIMONY. THIS CONCLUDES MY OPENING REMARKS.
