Second Quarter 1999 Shows Slight Drop in Bankruptcy Filings

The number of bankruptcy petitions filed in federal courts dropped slightly in the 12-month period ending March 31, 1999, according to statistics released today by the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts. Bankruptcy filings went from 1,423,128 in the 12-month period ended March 1998 to 1,419,199 in the same time period in 1999, a decline of 0.3 percent. This is the first time the total number of bankruptcy cases filed has fallen in federal courts since filings first hit the one million mark in 1996.

The number of bankruptcies filed during the second quarter of fiscal year 1999 (January 1, 1999—March 31, 1999) was 330,784, a 7 percent decrease over the 354,118 bankruptcy cases filed during the second quarter of FY98.

Despite this decrease, well over one million bankruptcy cases continue to be filed in federal court each year. The workload has strained a Judiciary where new bankruptcy judgeships were last created in 1992, and where the number of bankruptcy filings has increased by well over 500,000 between 1995 and 1999.

The Judicial Conference has asked Congress to create 24 new bankruptcy judgeships.

Filings by Chapter

Of the total number of bankruptcy filings for the 12-month period ending March 31, 1999, there were 1,017,049 Chapter 7 filings, a 1 percent increase over the 1,007,213 filings in the same period in 1998. The next largest group of filings were Chapter 13 filings at 393,245, a 3 percent

decrease over the 404,749 filings in the same 12-month period in 1998. Chapter 11 filings dropped to 8,010 in the 12-month period ending March 31, 1999, down from 10,244 in 1998. Chapter 12 filings

also fell in this period, from 880 in 1998 to 859 in 1999. Business filings totaled 41,128. Non-business filings totaled 1,378,071, up 1 percent from the total non-business filings of 1,370,490 in the 12-month period ending March 31, 1998.

Chapter 7 is designed to allow individuals to keep certain exempt property while the remaining property is sold to repay creditors. Under Chapter 13 bankruptcy, creditors may be repaid in installments, in full or in part, over a 3- to 5-year period. Chapter 11 provides for a business to continue operations while formulating a plan
