

Tanzania Compact Progress

- ★ **Energy Sector Project:** Preliminary design, environmental, and social assessment work is underway for all three Energy Project Activities. This includes a submarine cable survey for the Zanzibar Interconnector Activity, hydrology and aquatic species studies at the proposed Malagarasi hydropower plant site, and studies to determine electricity line routing in six underserved regions of Tanzania.
- ★ **Transport Sector Project:** In March 2009, MCA-T signed contracts to complete all design and environmental preparatory work for the Mainland Trunk Roads Activity. MCA-T also began initial steps in the bidding process for the road works contracts. On the Mafia Island Airport Activity, MCA-T is working with the Tanza-

nia Airports Authority and the Tanzania National Roads Agency to finalize the scope of work for updated designs and the completion of environmental and social preparatory work.

- ★ **Water Sector Project:** Work to update feasibility studies and produce final designs for the Non-Revenue Water Activity is underway. This Activity aims to improve water system efficiencies in Dar es Salaam by reducing both physical (leaky or broken pipes) and commercial (illegal water-pipe tapping) water losses. In the next quarter, MCA-T will award feasibility, environmental, and updated design work for the Lower Ruvu Water Treatment Plant and the rehabilitation of the Morogoro Water Supply System.

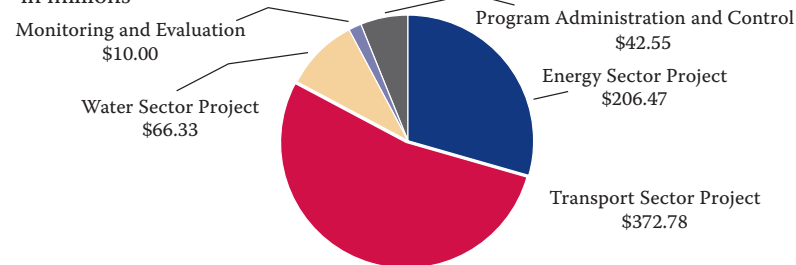

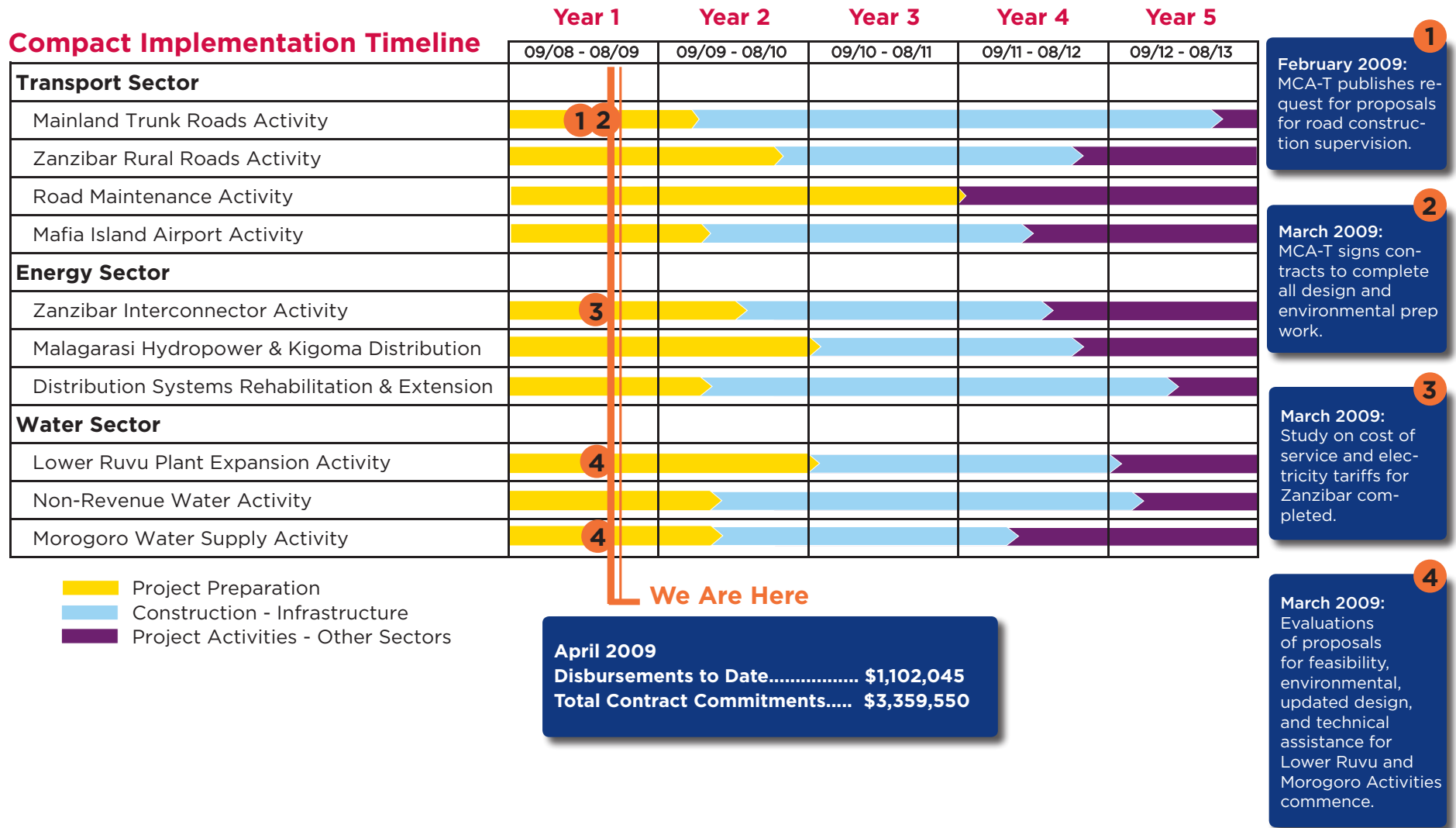
