The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 is now law and will be effective February 22, 2009. Here are the basic facts about how this law affects Unemployment Insurance.

## Additional \$25:

Each unemployment payment includes an additional \$25.

- This effects payments for any unemployment payments for weeks between February 22, 2009 and December 26, 2009. It is not retroactive.
- All UI claims and extensions (including TRA) are covered.
- The additional \$25 will be added to any weekly benefit payment of a dollar or more or if an overpayment offset reduces benefits to zero.
- The \$25 will not increase the Maximum Benefit Amount or balance on your claim.
- The \$25 does not affect earnings or deductible income calculations.
- Child Support will not be deducted from the \$25.
- State and Federal Tax Withholdings apply to the \$25.

Claimants cannot choose whether to receive the \$25. Everyone who meets the eligibility requirements will receive the payment, regardless of the effect the extra \$25 may have on other entitlement programs.

## Federal tax exemption:

The first \$2,400 of UI benefits received during the 2009 tax year are not subject to federal taxes. The first \$2,400 may still be subject to Oregon state taxes.
