NOTICE TO EMPLOYERS – CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT PILOT PROJECT

ASSISTANCE TO EMPLOYEES WITH CHILD SUPPORT OBLIGATIONS

Employers – please share this information with your employees who have child support obligations:

Child Support Enforcement (CSE) has a pilot project to help noncustodial parents whose jobs have been affected by the economic downturn and who may be unable to meet their child support obligations.

Noncustodial parents whose cases are being handled by CSE and who have been either temporarily or permanently laid off or whose hours have been significantly cut can participate in the pilot project.

Under the pilot project, CSE will prioritize the noncustodial parent's case and provide assistance in two areas:

- By pursuing a modification of the obligation by using the most recent income data and then filing a motion with the court for a modified order.
- By suspending certain enforcement tools, such as interest accrual and license suspension.

In some cases, noncustodial parents will be referred to the PRIDE program to improve their employment opportunities.
