SUPPORTING OUR TEACHERS ON MATTERS OF DISCIPLINE

I received a letter from 16 Democratic state legislators raising concerns about allegations of racial discrimination in some cases of discipline of students. The legislators requested a task force to explore creating a method for appeals from discipline decisions made by school districts.

I responded that we would investigate any allegations of racial discrimination in individual discipline cases. However, I am opposed to creating further layers of appeal. One of the initiatives of my administration has been to encourage school boards to support teachers in the application of strict discipline. I believe that we will not achieve high academic goals, unless we have an atmosphere of discipline where learning can take place.

Sponsored by Freeport McMoRan, the voluntary program incorporates Super Bowl XLII into Arizona history, geography and much more.


