**Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA Project**

WVGS has started a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS...

1. Go to the State Library URL at: <http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml>
2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
3. Click on WVGS DNA Project
4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form
6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen
7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one test.

You will receive a confirmation in your email box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However, you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

**Virginia Knapp**

Virginia Knapp is a Genealogy Volunteer on Tuesday mornings. She has been a volunteer for about 10 years, starting after she retired. She had a friend who volunteered here and encouraged Virginia to do the same, helping each other. It's a good thing to be able to do after retiring and a lot of fun. The OSL has many resources that don't often get used. It is a good place to do research; there's someone to help researchers, computers are available, and with the cost of gas these days it's close to home. And it is heartwarming to the volunteer to help patrons succeed in their genealogy projects.

Virginia has been doing genealogy for over 30 years, after a cousin visited who had been working on the family and provided her with information. Virginia's ancestors were early Virginians, Quakers and some New Englanders. She has mostly English ancestry and is still working on the early English in Virginia, including British officers. The Great Migration books from NEHGS that WVGS has purchased have been very helpful, as well as all the books on Virginia and Quakers. Her Oregon ancestral history is short, her grandfather coming to Oregon to work for the Oregonian. Virginia has been to the Family History Library in Salt Lake City numerous times and recommends it as a good place to start as they have many resources there all in one place.

Virginia's most interesting ancestor is Elizabeth Webb. Elizabeth was a Quaker, the wife of Richard Webb and mother of ten children. She was born in Gloucestershire, England about 1668. When she was 12 years old, she accompanied her mother to a few meeting of the Friends, and went to live with a member of the Society of Friends before age 20. She and her husband moved to Pennsylvania after her first religious visit to America. The Quakers allowed women to be ministers and Elizabeth was recognized as "a woman of a great gift in the ministry and endowed with many qualifications for usefulness in the church and world". She traveled around America from New England to South Carolina and back to England several times, taking news and messages, including urging Friends to consider the evils of owning slaves.

## WVGS News

March Program

The March Program was presented by Jim and Ann Riehl. They are members of **Oregon-California Trails Association (OCTA)** which is dedicated to the preservation, appreciation and enjoyment of the emigrant trails of the West. ([www.octa-trails.org](http://www.octa-trails.org))

Jim and Ann are involved with a project of OCTA, **Census of Overland Emigrant Documents (COED)**. The goal of COED is to survey and record in a database essential information from all known documents written by emigrants during their overland journey west. Ann presented a very interesting slide show of places along the trail while reading from letters and diaries of emigrants. The database started in 1985, supporting the trail history with paper documentation. 77,000 names are mentioned in their database so far, which also includes deaths, Indian attacks, family genealogy, and places. Jim showed examples of how they survey the documents and enter the data, all done by volunteers of COED. They have produced a CD, Emigrant Names, containing scans of the survey data. This CD was recently purchased by WVGS. Also subscription access to Emigrant Names data online may be found at [www.paper-trail.org](http://www.paper-trail.org). The site will be updated periodically, as new documents are located and surveyed. The search is free, but you must subscribe for a fee to get access to reports.

This was a very interesting and informative program, not only for genealogist researching Emigrant ancestors, but for everyone.

NARA Posts Free Passenger Indexes Online

The National Archives and Records Administration has added passenger lists of Russian, German and Italian immigrants to its free Access to Archival Databases (AAD). Each collection consists mostly of immigrants who identified their nationality as Russian, German or Italian and arrived at the ports of New York, Boston, Baltimore, New Orleans or Philadelphia during the 19th century.
