Emily Aulicino will be our guest speaker Saturday, April 18, for the monthly WVGS meeting. Emily will be presenting “**DNA Your Paper Trail: An Introduction to Genetic Genealogy**”. What is Genetic Genealogy? Learn the basics of DNA, which testing companies assist genealogists and how testing helps your research. Understand how to test all of your lineage and the reasons for doing so.
A \$30 gift certificate toward a DNA test at Family Tree DNA will be raffled to those who become members of the International Society of Genetic Genealogists

(ISOGG) at the meeting. The certificate has no deadline and is transferable. Time will be given to answer questions.

Emily is a recently retired teacher who has researched her family’s genealogy for over 37 years, traveling nationally and internationally for that purpose. She is the administrator of five email lists on Roots Web and another on Yahoo which helps genealogists and non-genealogists write their own family and personal memories. She teaches a monthly class on Genetic Genealogy at the Genealogical Forum of Oregon (Portland) which is open to the public. As the Speaker for and the Regional Coordinator of the International Society of Genetic Genealogists (ISOGG) for Oregon, Washington and Idaho, Emily gives presentations at any gathering on the subject of Genetic Genealogy and has done so since October 2005. She also manages eleven DNA projects through Family Tree DNA (FTDNA) which include surname, geographical and society projects. Since November 2005 she attended the annual FTDNA International DNA Conferences and has been a speaker for two sessions at the conference in 2007. In 2008, Emily was a speaker at the West Coast African-American Summit in Bellevue, Washington. In February 2009, she attended the genealogy and DNA conference in London called **Who Do You Think You Are**.

Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA Project

WVGS has a DNA Project for both men and women.

To join under WVGS:

1. Go to the State Library URL at: <http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml>
2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
3. Click on WVGS DNA Project.
4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form.
6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen.
7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one set.

You will receive a confirmation in your e-mail box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

The DNA Project is open to anyone, not just WVGS members. You are not charged until you send in your test kit. You can do the DNA testing through WVGS and submit it to other groups.

March Program

The March Program was presented by **Carl Taylor** of the South Salem LDS Family History Center. Carl talked about the Pedigree Resource File—submitted by members and cannot be changed. In 1965 the LDS Church asked every member to submit three generation family tree and formed the Ancestral File, sources were not kept when it was digitized. Both contain some errors and duplicate work.

The goal now is to index and digitize all 2.4 million rolls of microfilm and 1 million microfiche in the vault, all free to the public. Indexing can be done by anyone, not just members of the church. It is done on-line with tutorials and records downloaded onto your computer. Two people index each record and if there is difference, a third reviews the record. Another project, accessible at this time only to church members, is New Family Search in which all information about the same person will be collected into one file. This will be opened to everyone after it is completely rolled out.

The main genealogical site is **www.familysearch.org**. You can search records there, as well as the Pedigree Resource File, IGI, and Ancestral File. The new site where the new indexed and digitized records are is **http://labs.familysearch.org**. Selecting Record Search goes to searching the new indexes and images from around the world. Also there are research helps at **http://wiki.familysearch.org**.

You can help with indexing, since this will be free to everyone, at **www.familysearchindexing.org**.

Irish Roots: New Genealogical Records Available Online

The following was written by Library and Archives Canada: (Ottawa) December 22, 2008 — Library and Archives Canada is pleased to announce that its partner, the National Archives of Ireland, has launched the next important phase of an online census research tool for the Irish counties of Antrim, Kerry, and Down for 1911. The census records for all counties for 1911 and for 1901 will be made available online throughout 2009.

Library and Archives Canada signed an agreement with the National Archives of Ireland in December 2005 and the two institutions have been working to make the censuses of Ireland for 1901 and 1911 accessible online, free of charge. Library and Archives Canada's contribution included digitizing microfilm reels, linking images to the database and making the records searchable by name.

“With 70 million Irish Diaspora around the world, and up to one-fifth of Canadians claiming Irish heritage, this project will connect even more people to their historical roots,” stated Ian E. Wilson, Librarian and Archivist of Canada.

Making these records accessible online will give genealogists and historians around the world the chance to explore the age, occupation, religion and marital status of individuals. It will also allow research on Irish society of the early 20th century. The National Archives of Ireland have provided vibrant historical essays on topics such as social life, government, sport and religion and photographs depicting life in Ireland in 1911.

Papers of the War Department, 1784-1800

After a traumatic and devastating fire in 1800, many historians thought that the early files of the United States War Department were essentially lost forever. Thankfully, the Center for History and New Media at George Mason University recently completed a decade long project to locate all of these records and place them online here. The collection is a very important one, because during this time period the War Department was responsible for Indian affairs, veteran affairs, and naval affairs. The project was begun in earnest by Ted Crackel in the mid-1990s and it involved visits to over 200 repositories and consulting over 3,000 collections in the United States, Canada, England, France, and Scotland. Now, visitors can browse through 55,000 documents, and also perform detailed searches, complete with links to digitized images of each document. Interested parties can also browse the collection by year or person of interest. In short, this is an extremely valuable project that will be of interest to those with a penchant for American history, and early American military history in particular.

Graves get lost as mining can make it difficult for families to gain access to burial grounds. Sometimes the land passed from one company to another, sometimes cemeteries are relocated, but more often families are losing track of where their ancestor's graves are located.

All Things Cherokee

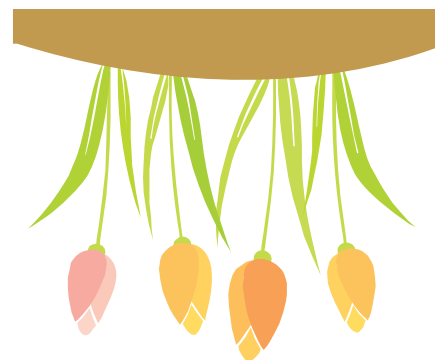
