#### Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA Project

WVGS has started a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS...

- 1. Go to the State Library URL at: http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml
- 2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
- 3. Click on WVGS DNA Project
- 4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form
- 6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen
- 7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one test.

You will receive a confirmation in your email box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However, you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

The DNA Project is open to anyone, not just WVGS members. You are not charged until you send in your test kit. You can do the DNA testing through WVGS and submit it to other groups.

#### **John Heffley**

John Heffley is one of the volunteers on Friday mornings. He has been a volunteer for about 5 years, starting because he wanted to learn how to use the library and work on his own family genealogy. He has been doing genealogy for about 15 years. Ancestors on his mother's side came on a wagon train to California and then on to Portland. He also has an ancestor immigrating from Germany in the 1860's, who was a landscaper in Portland and then homesteaded in Dufur. There's also a mysterious story about a connection to Kaiser Wilhelm! The Heffley's came to Independence about 1900 from Indiana. His grandfather had a farm on Market Street. The family immigrated from Germany in 1712 to Pennsylvania, then Indiana, Ohio, and kept moving west.

John has not made any genealogy trips but has been able to do his research from here, making connections with family in Indiana. The OSL was a big asset with invaluable resources. He is still learning what we have and by chance found a connection to Maryland in the records we have here.

**John** and his wife also volunteer at the Polk County Museum in Rickreall. John is a good resource on local history and resources. He learned there was a private cemetery on the family land, for early settlers in the Collins and Chamberlain families, and the cemetery is in the process of being restore. John has done DNA testing but is unsure of what those results mean!

#### **Budget Cuts at OSL**

Due to the need to reduce their budget for 2009, the Oregon State Library will not renew the subscription to ancestry.com which is available to the public on all computers in the Reference Room. The subscription will end in June 2009 and currently costs about \$3,900 per year. WVGS is unable to fund this valuable resource. It is a popular and necessary aid in genealogical researching. If you have any suggestions for how to retain ancestry.com at the OSL, please contact WVGS President George Cropsey or any other WVGS officer. A suggestion has been made to apply for a grant. If you have any skills in grant writing and would like to work on this, please let George know.

#### **November Program**

**Ruby Pantalone** presented a program on how she found the English ancestry of her mother-in-law. Ruby started with her mother-in-law's aunt, a half sister who was a nun here in the United States, from which she found the real name of the aunt, parents and where she was born. She then used the site (http://freebmd.rootsweb.com/). FreeBMD FreeBMD is an ongoing project, the aim of which is to transcribe the Civil Registration index of births, marriages and deaths for England and Wales, and to provide free Internet access to the transcribed records. It is a part of the FreeUKGEN family. After searching and finding her husband's ancestors she was able to get birth and marriage records for several generations in England. It did require getting up at 3 am to place a call to England!

You do need a place and date to get started in English research. The recording of births, marriages and deaths was started in 1837 and is one of the most significant resources for genealogical research. The transcribing of the records is carried out by teams of dedicated volunteers and contains index information for the period 1837-1983.

Thank you Ruby for an excellent and informative program!

#### **Tennessee Death Records Are Available Online**

Many of the death records for the state of Tennessee are available online. Registrations of births and deaths began in 1908 in Tennessee. The Tennessee State Archives and Library web site has created an index that covers nearly 98,000 deaths occurring in Tennessee and recorded between 1908 and 1912. Although deaths were not registered as carefully and regularly as they were beginning in 1914, the index includes all extant records.

The index includes the name of the deceased, county, year of death and certificate number. This information can be used to order a copy of the death certificate from the Tennessee State Library and Archives. Death records in this time period do not give parents' names. They do include the individual's age, occupation, place of birth and cause of death.

The Tennessee death records for 1908-1912 are at http://www.tennessee.gov/tsla/history/vital/death2.htm.

Death records for 1913 were not recorded in Tennessee.

Tennessee deaths from 1914 to 1926 are available at the state government's web site at http:// www.tennessee.gov/tsla/history/vital/tndeath.htm. The index lists name of deceased, county of death, and volume and page number of the certificate. When ordering a death record from this index, please include this information. This information should be used when ordering the full death record

Finally, the Memphis Public Library History and Genealogy Index Web site at http://tempo.memphislibrary.org/dadabik/program\_files/sform.php contains the Memphis/Shelby County Death Index (1848-1945). This index to identifiable deaths recorded within Memphis and Shelby County was created from the Memphis Death Register Books beginning in 1848; Memphis Burial Permits, 1902-1913; and Memphis/Shelby County Death Certificate Card Index, 1914-1945. Entries include the name, date of death, age, gender, and race of the deceased, as well the source record. This index also includes people who died in Memphis but were buried elsewhere and those whose bodies were brought back from another location for burial. In addition, there is a list of licenses granted to ship bodies through Memphis.

This same database also contains the Yellow Fever Deaths Index (1878), listing all identified Memphians who died in the 1878 Yellow Fever Epidemic. Entries include the death date, full name, race and address.

Library and Archives Canada (LAC) is pleased to announce the launch of an online database, Immigrants to Canada. The database contains Canadian immigration records held at LAC, many of which relate to immigrants from the British Isles arriving in Quebec and Ontario: also included are references to settlers in other provinces. Through this new database, researchers can access references to lists of immigrants and other types of records created before 1865, such as declarations of aliens and names of some Irish orphans.

A group at University College London has launched the Worldnames Surname Profiler on their PublicProfiler.org website. The site plots 8 million names, using data that comes from electoral rolls and telephone directories around the world. Covering 300 million people in 26 countries, users can see where certain surnames originated, and where they have migrated to. www.publicprofiler.org/ worldnames

#### **German Research**

The November/December issue of Everton's Ge**nealogical Helper** has a comprehensive article on German research. A few of the websites are listed below but the article also covers what's available (no national censuses were taken), church records and civil registrations not available on-line.
