The March speaker will be Carl Taylor of the South Salem LDS Family History Center. The Family History Centers and familysearch.org are important and necessary tools in genealogy research. Carl says "I will try to summarize on the 14th the recent momentous family history undertakings of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the Church's Family History Library, and the Utah Genealogical Society. I will also introduce everyone to the opportunity to volunteer in the indexing of digital records that is part of this enormous undertaking."

"I am a volunteer (called by local Church leaders) to serve as the director of the Salem Oregon Family History Center on Lone Oak in south Salem. I have served in this capacity for nearly 5 years. I am not a professional, nor very diligent, genealogist. I have a PhD from BYU in Instructional Psychology. My wife, Bonnie (the real genealogist in the family) and I are the parents of 8 children and 18 grandchildren (so far). Professionally I am a financial Advocate with Beneficial Financial Group."

Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's <u>DNA Project</u>

WVGS has a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS:

- Go to the State Library URL at: http:// oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml
- 2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
- 3. Click on WVGS DNA Project.
- 4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form.
- 6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen.
- 7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one set.

You will receive a confirmation in your e-mail box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

February Program

Stephenie Flora was the February speaker, talking about "History of the Families that settled at the end of the Oregon Trail". She started with a brief history of the settling of Oregon by the white people, including Robert Stewart and Jason Lee in 1834 and the French-Canadian traders and trappers who settled at French Prairie. Early settlers often are overlooked at they didn't come in a "wagon train", the first wagon train that made all the way was in 1843. The emigrants were strong-willed, opinionated and had to have strength of character. Stephenie read comments from journals of the travelers and talked about many misconceptions we have about the trips. When asked about "circling the wagons", she sent this reply, "For the most part the pioneers just camped in small groups in an area that provided convenient food for their cattle. They would have guards in shifts overseeing the cattle and the camp during the night. However, in some areas where food or water was not available or when there was some danger, they circled the wagons forming a corral and put the stock inside so they did not wander off (or get stolen). They then slept in tents outside the circled wagons."

Stephenie also talked about her website (www.oregonpioneers.com) and her ongoing project as well as resources that she uses. Her handout of resources is available at the Reference Desk as well as the Oregon Emigrant Trail Resource document for resources available at OSL. Stephenie presented a very interesting program with a look at the lives of the emigrants, interesting even if you don't have ancestors that came on the Oregon Trail. We're looking forward to having her back in October to talk about the Whitman Massacre.

Oregon 150 Booklist

To help commemorate Oregon's sesquicentennial, the State Library is pleased to announce the Oregon 150 Booklist. The list consists of 150 books for children, teens and adults that describe the Oregon experience, including fiction, non-fiction, history, and poetry. The books are available in libraries and bookstores and are highly recommended for all Oregonians to read during the sesquicentennial.

The books present a comprehensive view of the Oregon experience, including the stories and voices of the tribes that inhabited Oregon for millennia to those of the many cultures that live here today. The oldest book on the list is Astoria: or, Anecdotes of an Enterprize Beyond the Rocky Mountains by Washington Irving, originally published in 1836. The newest book is Oregon at Work: 1859-2009 by Art Ayre and Tom Fuller, that will be published this spring by Ooligan Press.

"For 150 years, Oregon has been a state of readers and writers," said State Librarian Jim Scheppke. "It's no accident that we have some of the best libraries and bookstores anywhere in the country. It's our hope that many Oregonians will use this reading list to spend time in 2009 reading and reflecting on the Oregon experience."

The Oregon 150 Booklist is one of many ways the State Library and other state agencies are observing the sesquicentennial. The State Library is hosting a monthly lecture series on Oregon topics and is a co-sponsor, with the Oregon Library Association, of *Oregon Reads 2009*, a statewide community reading project. Important Notice

The Research Library will be closed February 28th - March 13th. Please check back after March 13th for new hours.

Because of declining revenue projections for 2009, the OHS Board of Trustees has directed management to reduce expenditures and lay off staff members to bring the budget into balance. The main causes of revenue decline are:

- A 2009-10 state appropriation that is forecast to be 65% lower (\$800,000 per year less) than last year's
- A probable take-back of \$350,000 from the 2009 state appropriation
- The loss of approximately \$400,000 in annual endowment earnings
- A drop in giving to the OHS annual appeal

"The reduction in expenses will allow us to focus on excellent core programs that serve more than 50,000 Oregonians each year." Said George Vogt, Executive Director.

Public access to the library collections will necessarily be limited after mid-March, and the Society will post information, including hours and condition of access, on the website shortly. The Society will continue to provide access to photographic and film collections and will continue to partner with Oregon Public Broadcasting in the production of *Oregon Experience*.

We urge everyone to contact his or her state legislators with messages of support for the Oregon Historical Society's appropriation.
